GED testing format changes

Idahoans must finish diplomas by 2001 or start their studies anew

Twin FALLS - Folks working on their high school general equivalency diplomas must finish them within the next few years or risk loaing credits they already have earned.

GED curriculum and tests are being updated to correspond with education reforms sweeping the country. The new formar - yet to be finalized - would increase the importance of applying skills to real-life situations. It's an important issue for Idahoans, some of whom began working on their GEDs, in the 1970s, said Veneta Jenkins, GED chief examiner arche College of Southern Idahoa.

Idaho does not require GEDs to be completed in a specified period. But if students
don't finish their work by the time the new
GED tests are introduced in 2001, none of
it will count.
The majority of people who start their
GEDs at CSI finish within a year, justings

begin the program and \$30 complete it. While the completion rate has improved annually, the number of students who don't finish remains high.

The majority of states are in Idaho's position, said Joan Auchter, executive director of the GED Testing Service in Washington, D.C.

GED tests emerged in 1942, were revamped in 1977 and again in 1988. In the pass, people still working for their diplomas did not lose credits when the changes occurred.

The law is so obscure that few at the DMY or even the attorney general's office knew it existed. And the use of "school bus chrome" in the code to describe a color is at best archaic.

A new drug cuts the rate of breast cancer deaths by two-thirds among women at high risk of getting new tumors, a study has found.

The drug clodronate, is one of a class of compounds known as bisphosphonates that prevent bone loss from osteoporosis and cancer.

Waterfalls? Check. Large, picturesque mammals? Check. Raging rivers with cooling mist? Check. Dark forests and sunny sapen grows? Check. Grand Teton National Park is a checklist-kind of place. The 200 miles of trails that criss-cross the park offer a visual feast. Here are a handful of classic Teton day hikes, ranging from a one-mile nature trail rated easy to a 3,000-vertical-foot gut-buster, rated difficult.

Lunchtree Hill/Willow Flats

This trail begins at Jackson Lake Lodge. Leave from the reary head right, and follow an asphalt trail up the hill. This is a great place for mose-watching as they browse the greenery at Willow Flats below. And keep your eyes open here for sandhill cranes,

open here for succession.

Elevation change: 100 feet.

Total distance: one mile. Rating:

Hidden Falls

This is undoubtedly the most popular hike in the park, which means it's the most plagued by crowds, too. Locals will steer you away from it, but it's actually worth the hustle and bustle. To






