The attack, which the administration said would last up to four days, was designed to diminish Iraq's ability to produce outlewed nuclear, chemical and biological weapons, Clinton said in a nationally relevised address from the Oval Office.



Illinois Representative LaHood will chair impeachment vote

WASHINGTON—When the U.S. House of Representatives assembles to consider impeaching President Clinton, the man with the gavel will be an old-style Republican of the sort who dominated House Republican analys before the 1994 "revolution" swept in the hard-core conservatives who are now speatheading the campaing against Chinton. Rep. Newt Gingrich, Reda., who has seeighed as speaker as of next year, has declined to preside. Gingrich, Speaker-cobe and the state of the stat



Attorney presses for land auctions

Court hears request to overturn amendment

The Associated Press

BOISE - The Idaho Watersheds Project pressed its demand that auctions be con-ducted whenever the state leases public lands, urging the state Supreme Court to void a just-adopted constitutional amend-ment for clearly eliminating a require-

ment for lease auctions.

Attorney Laird Lucas maintained Wednesday that the way the amendment was officially framed, overs were unaware when they overwhelming approved it last month that it would strip the constitution of what he called the clearest requirement for lease auctions.

As he did less than two weeks ago, Lucas again argued that the state's school-children are the ones affected when leases for grazing-or any other state land in the public education endowment are issued without competitive bioding.

"When there was no auction, less money was generated for public schools," Lucas told the high court.

High countered that material supplied to
voters clearly stated that any auction
requirement for leases was being eliminated from the constitution. Auctions are
clearly required for land sales.

Stanley Lake Road

Be sure everyone is suited for the difficulty of the trip. Even an easy ski tour can go horribly awry if heavy snow begins to fall and high winds oblinerate your tracks.

F&G has job ahead in acquainting angless with threatened species

BOISE (AP) — Bull trout numbers were low enough this year to make it a threatened species, but as many as two-thirds of the anglers fishing the upper reaches of the Boise River can't tell it from other trout.

Idaho Department of Fish and Game biologists polled sportsmen on the river to find out how many knew the difference between the bull trout protected under the Endangered Species Act and game fish-like the plentiful brook room.

"We didn't set out to get the people surveyed in trouble," fisheries biologist. Dan Schill said. "We Just wanted to know the average angler's fish identification abilities. Based on these results, we'll try to come up with some tools we can give them to do a better job."

The survey on the Boise's mid-dle and south forks encompassed a wide array of fishermen — fly, lure and bait — including those casting in Arrowrock and Anderson Ranch reservoirs. They checked 549 people on the Middle Fork and 121 on the South Fork.

The biologists tried cards with colored pictures of various fish, including the bull trout, but quickly switched to a plywood board with a mounted replica of a

board with a mounted replica of a built root.

Almost 70 percent of the Middle Fork anglers failed to identify the replica as a built root, and a third of them thought it was actually a brook trout or a species with even greater physi-lal differences like a grayling, squawish or whitefish.

The results were a little better on the South Fork, Still, more than half could not identify the built root.

Flyfishing afficinades who favor the two streams were most likely to correctly identify bull trout, but even then barely half did.

Not even a third of those using artificial lures and less than a fifth of the bait fishermen identified the threatened fish.


