



### Salmon-eating terns prove tough to relocate

SEATTLE (AP) — Birds blamed for eating millions of salmon from already depleted Northwest-runs-stocks are proving difficult to relocate. Wildlife officials have been working to move the Caspian terms from Rice Island, about 20 miles upstream from the

Columbia's mouth, to another, island further downstream where they hope the birds will not be able to catch as many salmon. The birds have been blamed by Idaho Gov. Dirk Kempthorite and other state officials along with sportsmen's groups for aggravating the imported situation of

Idaho salmon and steelhead.
Officials from the Casplan Term Relocation Project set up nesting barriers on Rice Island and improved nesting habitat on East Sand Island. Saltwater intrusion from the Pacific Ocean is more pronounced by East Sand Island, and biologists hope the birds will

switch from salmon smolts to more saltwater species like herring. But most of the terns are sraying on Rice Island as they rerum from wintering grounds off Central and South America. Some even nested next to a 3-foot-tall wooden scarcerow painted to look like a bald eagle.
