IDAHO FALLS — The environmental groups will ask a federal court judge Wednesday

to bar federal grazing on all allotments in Cassia County, and federal officials can seize cattle persons.

Federal law allows a cattle person to graze livestock on public land, says Land Lance, lawyer for the Idaho Waterways Project and the Committee for Idaho's Public Lands.

Lance works for the Land and Water Fund of the Rockies.

On Monday, U.S. District Court Judge E. Wayne Winters ruled that the Bureau of Land Management must not renew grazing permits at the Idaho Waterways Project's 1,000-acre ranch in Cassia County.

Winters ruled that the Bureau of Land Management violated the National Environmental Policy Act by failing to consider the impact of grazing on the environment.
