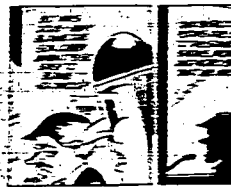

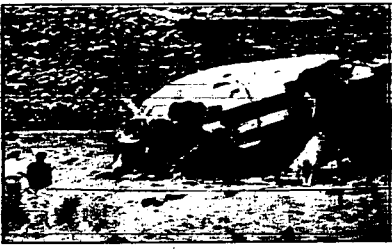

Deadly airliner crash terrifies passengers

LITTLE ROCK, Ark. (AP)—With flames blazing in and their clothes drenched with aviation fuel, terrified passengers aboard American Airlines Flight 1420 squeezed through a twisted emergency exit and scrambled out popping holes in the fuselage.

"All I thought was that I was going to die," said passenger Summe Montgomery. "Everyone was panicking and yelling to get out of that plane. We were on our hands and knees, and the smoke was so thick we couldn't breathe."

"Even I grabbed a few people, because your normal instinct to survive just kicks in," she said. "Landing from a fast approach, the storm had cracked around Flight 1420 as it approached Little Rock on Tuesday night. Even the voice that the cockpit had a sense of apprehension."

"We all knew something was going wrong because of the turbulence. I had never flown at night, but with all that wind and rain, I was sure we would crash," said Ms. Montgomery, who was in Row 7.

"The captain came over the intercom a lot earlier than usual and he told us we'd better get our seatbelts on."

Pasquotter Barrett Baber said the plane seemed to be coming in landing faster than normal. "I thought we were going to be OK. All we knew was that there was bad weather," Baber said. "The plane was going so fast, when we hit the ground, we went off the end of the runway."

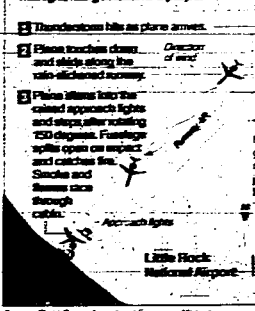
Passengers said it seemed the plane's tires never popped as the Super MD-80, carrying 139 passengers and a crew of six, barreled down Runway 4R toward the Arkansas River.

"When we hit the ground, I thought, 'Thank God that we'll be safe,'" Ms. Montgomery said. "Then I looked out of my window and all I saw was grass. I proved that we'd stop, but we kept on going."

The airplane slid off the 7,200-foot runway, ran an access road and whipped around a metal tower for houses that lead south-

bound planes to the Little Rock National Airport. The stationer acted like a gas operator, reading back the plane's trim shell on the left side from the captain's controls through the first-class section. The fire started behind that point, from fuel spilled as the plane broke up.

"One side of it ripped off like a

sardine can," Mayor Jim Dailey said.

Jason Klamm, 15, of Pine Bluff said he escaped as fire spread toward the first-class section, where he was sitting. "All of a sudden I saw a big chunk of the plane just fall away," he said.

The jarring collision with the tower broke open other cracks in

the aircraft — some just wide enough to allow emergency exits. The cockpit door broke open, and the emergency exit seats were ejected out of the fuselage.

There were 130 people on board, including Capt. James D. Smith, 44, and First Officer John W. Smith, 43, who were not on the plane. They said to stay near the emergency exit door.

David Smith, of Warren, said he was only 10.

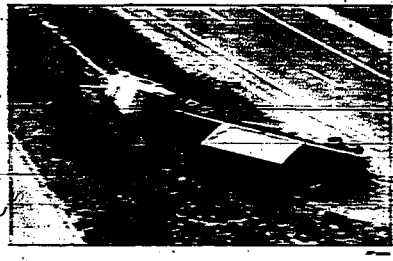
