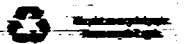

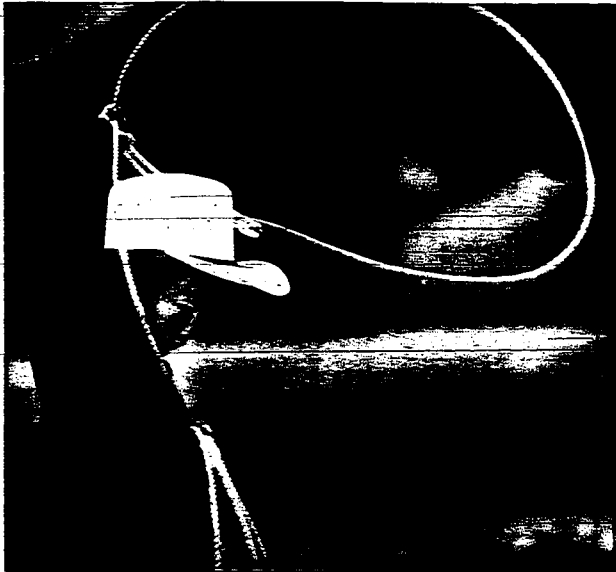

# NATO may ease bombing campaign as early as Sunday

**BELGRADE, Yugoslavia** — NATO leaders agreed Friday to ease their relentless air campaign against Yugoslavia and the Pentagon said the bombing could end by Sunday if President Slobodan Milosevic keeps his promise to begin withdrawing Kosovo forces.

Still, key differences over the deployment of Russian peacekeepers threatened to delay a U.N. Security Council resolution formalizing the Kosovo peace accord that Milosevic agreed to on Thursday.

Russian officials expressed concern Friday over the possibility of a peace plan for Kosovo.

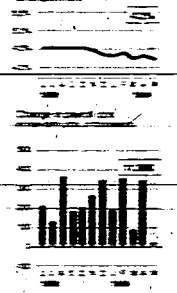
**TWIN FALLS**—An attempt to jump a motorcycle over a fence Friday night ended in disaster when the rider was thrown from the bike and landed on his back.

Finally, parents should be aware of the dangers of children being lured into a car by a stranger. This is a common tactic used by kidnappers.

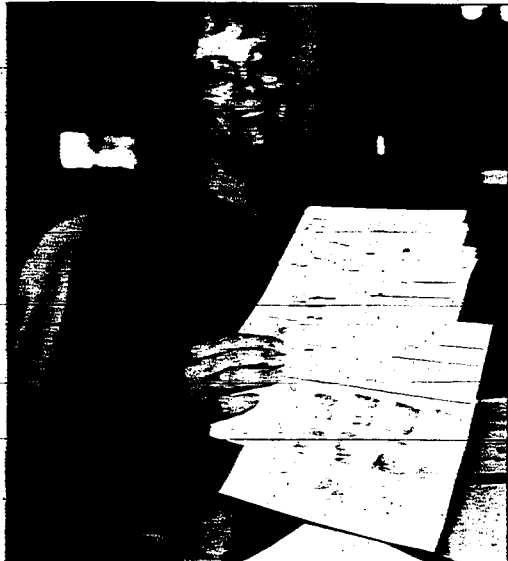

# Analysts: War effects changes

## Europe may keep U.S. out of security

*The war spins the all-out effort and says that it is over, but there will be serious repercussions from NATO's actions in Yugoslavia.*

What really bothered Beijing, China specialists say, was the precedent set by NATO's action. China is particularly worried that the United States may intervene in Taiwan, which China regards as its sacred province and has not raised out since 1949 to this day.

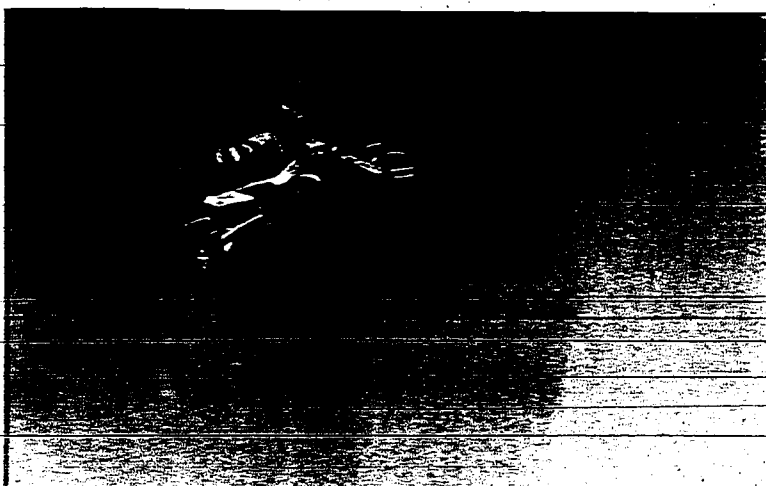

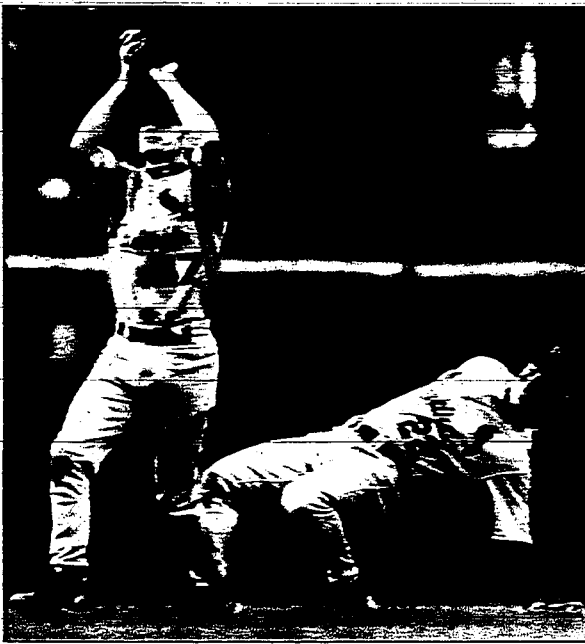

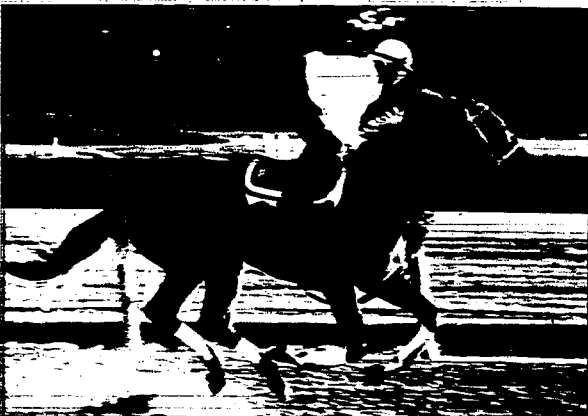

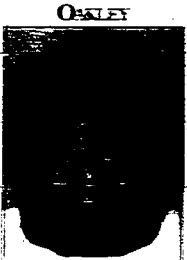

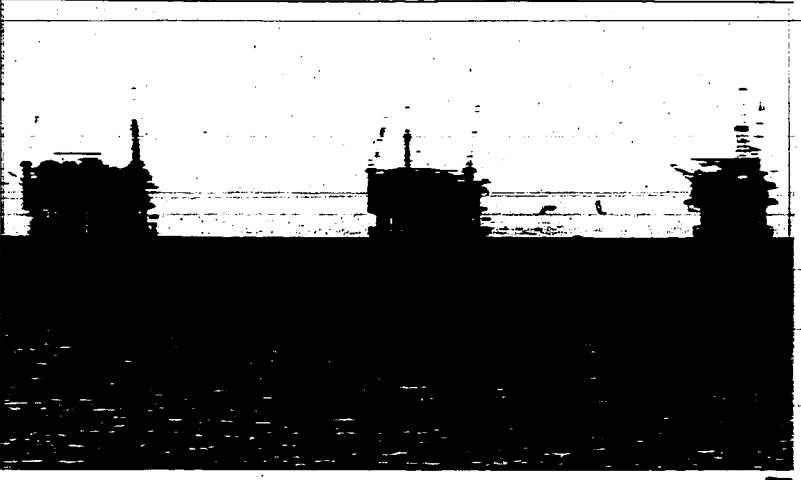

## Seminar offers hope to parents and gay Christians

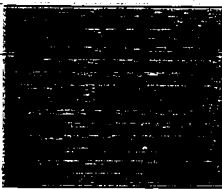
**MEMPHIS** — Understanding and acceptance will be key topics at next week's seminar for Christian parents who have gay or lesbian children.

In the 1997 United States Catholic Bishops' Pastoral Statement titled "Always Our Children," the Catholic Church expressed the issue of homosexuality from a family angle. This workshop, presented by Father Robert Nugent and Sister Jeanette Gonzalez, will focus on helping Christians understand the position of the church regarding homosexuality.

The workshop is being sponsored by the Catholic Parents Network, an association of Catholic parents who have gay or lesbian children. Nugent and Gonzalez used to be Catholic divorcees and offer instruction on how to work with gay and lesbian children and their families.

Nugent holds degrees from the Catholic University of Louisiana and Yale Divinity School and has written on homosexuality and religion for Catholic journals. Gonzalez, who holds a Ph.D. in education from the University of Pennsylvania, edited "The Vatican and the World" and "Homosexuality in the Bible and the Church." She has helped develop the pastoral letter.

"The church is asking parents to accept their children as God's precious creation and love and accept them as gifts from God," Gonzalez said.



The pastoral letter says that a gay or lesbian relationship is "not a sin" but that the church has a duty to care for and support them.

In the past, many parents have dealt with the issue in a private way and the church has not had an open dialogue on the issue, said Nugent.

"This is the first time that the church provides a major document dealing with the topic of homosexuality from the family aspect," Nugent explained. "This is the first time that the church has issued a statement that does not state that homosexuality is a sin."

Costs are free. The seminar is a service associated with the church. Nugent and Gonzalez said.
