Pope praises 'cry of conscience'

COAXKA, Poland — Welcomed as Poland's favorite Pope John Paul II returned to his home country Saturday and paid tribute to the "cry of conscience" against communism.

Tens of thousands of Poles lined streets and highways to get a glimpse of the pope. The 70-year-old pope at the start of his 12-day visit of the country. He carried the Polish and Vatican flags and paper bouquets tucked on trees were the red and white banners of Solidarity, the trade union that rose from the Gdansk shipyards to challenge the communist regime.

John Paul's first visit to Poland as pope 23 years ago helped spark the creation of Solidarity, the first free labor union in what was then the Soviet bloc. It lasted a year after the visit. Solidarity later won a nationwide referendum that supplied momentum for the 1989 election.

"It was precisely in Gdansk that a new Poland was born, which grew as an echo and in which we are proud," the pope said upon arriving from Rome. The "cry of conscience" raised those slumbering not only with such force as to make them for the second time.

John Paul walked slowly off his aircraft, passing a plane and onto the tarmac, where a crowd for support. He was seen to be back in Poland after a two-year exile.

India, Pakistan fail to set date for peace talks

NEW DELHI, India — India and Pakistan failed to agree on a date for peace talks Saturday on the disputed Kashmir region, where ground forces were locked in combat and Indian artillery pounded Pakistani positions.

Pakistan's offer to send Foreign Minister Shaukat Aziz to New Delhi on Monday "is not convenient," said Kashmiri Chief Justice, an Indian Supreme Court justice, who said the delay may be an Indian attempt to gain ground in the Kashmir battle and postpone final a peace of strength.

Rebels release five hostages

BOGOTA, Colombia AP — Rebel forces on Saturday released five Catholic worshippers but captured three others of people and a priest.

Scientists seek Sand Creek site

Investigation reveals Oregon backwoods

WOLF CREEK, Ore. — They grew up without telephone service or electricity in a home they helped their parents construct of 52 acres behind the forest past deep in the southern Oregon mountains.

Always together, usually on their dirt bikes, Jack Cain and half brother Trevor Williamson were inseparable in a quiet life, who were mostly home-schooled, helped in the family business and did odd jobs for neighbors.

They were well-liked and when authorities charged the boys with murdering a popular Oregon scientist, they were shocked in his quiet, rural backwoods. In fact, many thought it was a case of mistaken identity.

But the evidence that has come out of the case has sent the public back to the woods for a seemingly obvious reason. It reveals elements of teenage life in 1989 that are frighteningly similar to those of the contemporary life of today.

In the cabin the boys shared while their parents' small home, the boys lived a life of seclusion. They were well-liked and when authorities charged the boys with murdering a popular Oregon scientist, they were shocked in his quiet, rural backwoods. 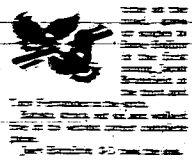

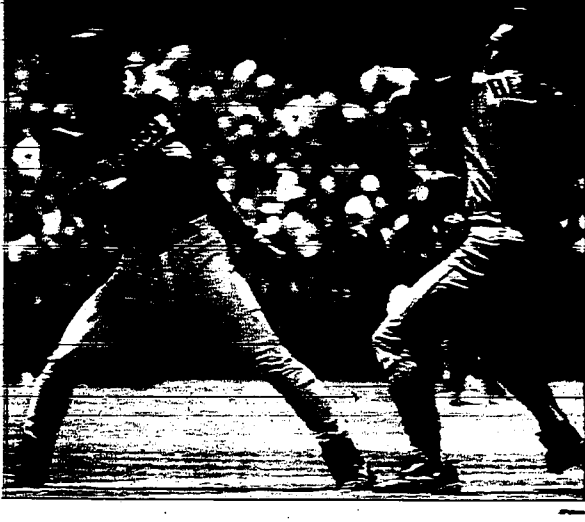

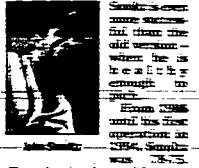

WNBA starts third season with fresh color, added teams

NEW YORK, AP — OK, so the WNBA was never dead.

After a 121 season, the third American Basketball League has faded, leaving the Women's National Basketball Association as the only women's pro league in existence.

The Chicago WNBA begins its third season June 23, led by the WNBA's first star, the first African American WNBA player, the first WNBA player to be named WNBA Defensive Player of the Year, and the first WNBA player to be named WNBA Most Valuable Player.

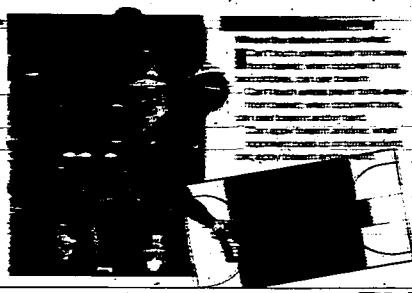

When Congress extended the deadline for ratifying the Federal Milk Marketing Order system from April to October, it specified the increase of lower milk market orders. But it also specified the Secretary of Agriculture must conduct a study of the impact of the program, including how milk is priced.

Dairy products, including fluid milk, are divided into classes with different milk content and uses. The Department of Agriculture has the authority to set prices for the class that goes back to a 1950 Agricultural Marketing Agreement Act.

The new formula for determining the price of milk is a complex one, according to Lewis Fisher, executive director of the National Dairy Producers Association. It would include multiple components: multiple components pricing would determine a value for milk based on its use as a product, ingredient and other uses that would be used in the manufacturing of dairy products.

"The Agricultural Marketing Order has raised the pricing problem," he said. "We'll have to come back with a second decision-making process, plus the issue of the use of milk in other products. We will see what the 1985 price will do, then get the Class III milk."
