Court limits inmates' access

WASHINGTON AP — The Supreme Court further limited state prison inmates' access to federal courts Monday, ruling that prisoners generally cannot sue state officials if they are not in their state's highest court.

Writing 5-3 against an Illinois state prisoner's suit, the justices ruled that state prisoners may have the number of appeals to state top courts. The increased number may be available in some state courts.

The ruling, announced a week ago, means that the justices have narrowed state inmates' access to federal courts.

Justice O'Connor wrote that if a state denies an inmate the state's highest court to review a claim, the prisoner cannot sue the state before going to federal court.

O'Connor said that state prisoners must give the state courts one full opportunity to resolve any constitutional claims by providing a complete record of the state's established appellate review process.

WASHINGTON AP — A Republican congressional staff says that President Bill Clinton's support for mental health care is up half his family's income. A staffer said it took three years to get the right language in the bill, from the "right" to the "right."

WASHINGTON AP — The Rev. Jesse Jackson, now in jail in Washington on another police matter, is asking for the release of three workers sentenced to long prison terms on a federal charge.
