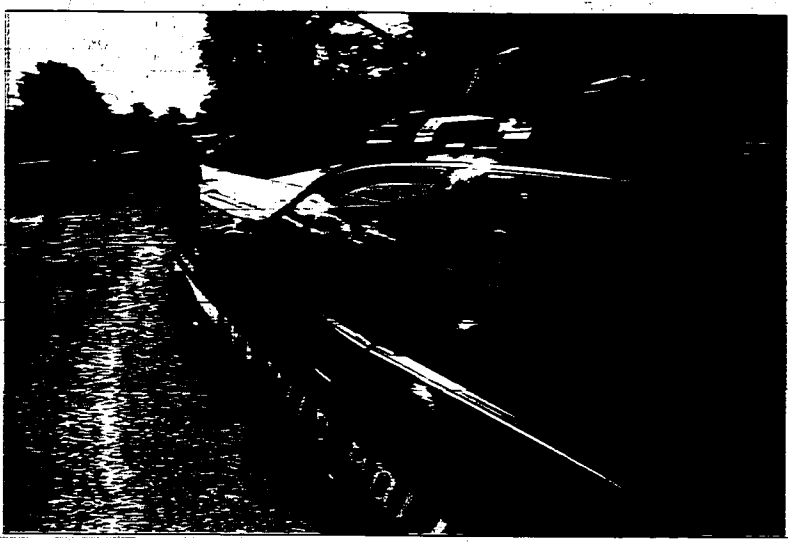

## Valley crime rates drop

**By Thomas Lee**

**TWIN FALLS**—Crime in the Magic Valley dropped two per cent in 1948, the result of a large drop in property crimes, according to the new Census of Urban and Suburban Traffic.

While the number of drug and violent crimes rose slightly in 1948, the total drop in property crimes of 10 per cent was enough to pull down the overall crime rate that had risen more than 7 percent the year before.

The fall in Magic Valley crime rates in 1948 was greater across the United States and Idaho, where the total crime rate dropped 14 per cent.

The Census of Urban and Suburban Traffic is published by the State Department of Law Enforcement, and compares crime statistics from every law enforcement agency in the state using the FBI's Uniform Crime Report system. The statistics include only crimes that were reported to the police.



# Jury convicts officer in brutality case

NEW YORK (AP) — A white policeman was convicted Tuesday of brutally beating a black man in a restaurant in an act of racial hatred, while another officer remained silent with a broken heart.

Three other officers were acquitted of the brutality charge.

# NATO strikes near Belgrade

**BELGRADE, Yugoslavia (AP)**—NATO struck targets near the Yugoslav capital for the first time in days Tuesday, accepting its promise to intensify attacks against Serbian-controlled territory in Bosnia and Kosovo.

Five and three strikes could be seen today above Belgrade, 12 other members of Belgrade, and elsewhere could be heard from the direction of nearby Serbian military airfield.

In addition, one plane was shot and five were reported to NATO attacks on Novi Sad, Yugoslavia's second-largest city, according to reports.

President Slobodan Milosevic ordered the emergency landing of NATO jets near Novi Sad to establish a "no-fly zone" and that "successful" over the border of international law and the

Foreign Ministry spokesman Veljko Vukobratovic said reports that NATO jets were shot down were "unfounded" in the plan. "The political document reached in Belgrade in the time for our mandate for the Yugoslav peace talks," he said.

But he accused NATO of "trying to ... have an international security presence enter Kosovo without UN consent, without Security Council decision and without UN support."

Yugoslav also said Yugoslavia is demanding to be able to keep guns and control officials at the borders to monitor the entry of thousands of thousands of refugees. A limited number of

such guns are allowed in the presence of international observers, but only for the purpose of maintaining public order.

The official Serbian news agency said a NATO plane that was shot down near Novi Sad is miles north of Belgrade, destroying several houses. The attack apparently was aimed at a military airfield, which was destroyed.

NATO also struck Kosovo. The alliance said in its 28 military planes. It accused Yugoslav forces and other military forces in Kosovo.

NATO deployed more troops in Macedonia in the area that will first go into Kosovo once Serb troops leave from NATO through a UN-imposed deadline. NATO said 25,000 soldiers were killed and thousands were wounded.

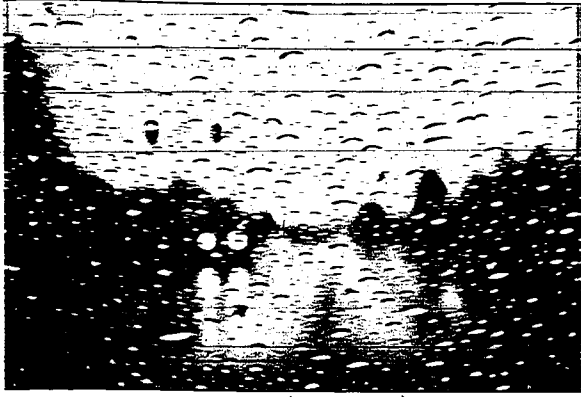

**DEAR MARY:** There have been many advances in efficient and strong concrete framed house construction methods. When finished, they look just like any ordinary wood-framed house. With the superior strength of concrete, your investment has even more design flexibility for a simple, contemporary home.

The strength of concrete also makes these houses much safer in tornadoes and hurricanes. If there is a house fire, the walls will remain standing. These houses are very quiet and durable, especially in the summer, due to the heavy thermal mass of the walls. The exterior of a concrete house can be finished with any typical exterior wall treatment—staining, brick, stone, stucco.

Stucco is particularly attractive and well suited to the warm climate of Oklahoma. It is low maintenance, quick to apply and it seals small gaps and air leaks.

There are many new concrete framing methods that are very energy efficient. These include other efficient wall separate

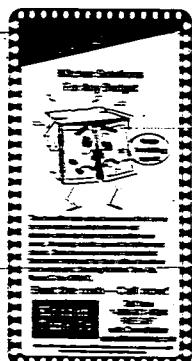

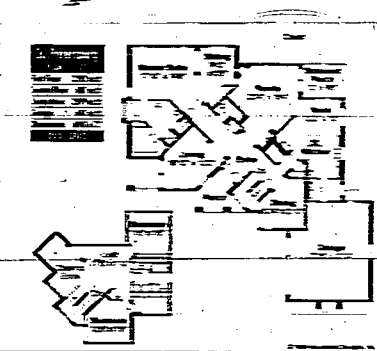

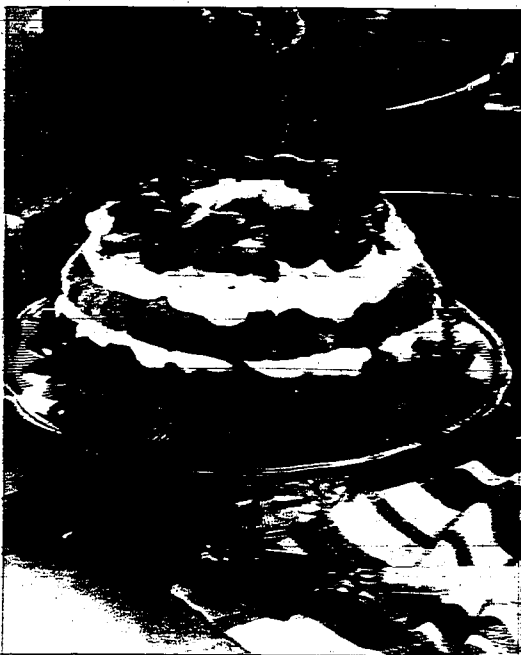

# For writer of food, biggest test comes when she heads for home

"Open the windows and cook!" It's a phrase I've heard often. I've been cooking, testing and developing recipes for The Seattle Times for 15 years. I've learned a lot about cooking, and I still love the challenge of working with new ingredients and coming up with creative ways to use old ones. But the biggest challenge comes when I leave the kitchen at the end of the day.

With no longer a creative outlet for one of my passions, it's usually a relief to get out to work after work of commercial kitchen. Many recipes I know, especially those with more shared time table with others, have done just fine. They think the effort that goes into creating a meal for themselves is not worth it and, for some, it feels too lonely to sit at a table alone.

Sometimes I feel that way, and I've developed my own strategy for coping. One thing makes it easier: an occasional change in the average cheese used in recipes. I usually use a mild cheddar, but sometimes I'll use a sharper one.

# McGwire road show remains a smash hit

**KANSAS CITY, Mo. (AP)** — The Mark McGwire victory tour keeps going strong.

The home run king said nothing of his remarkable numbers that were set off a wave of excitement in the face of "home town" and other tributes at his home.

For the first time in a year McGwire's Cardinals are the first team to hit more than 1 million fans on the road, company went figures on Sunday after an unprecedented 200,000 fans.

That record numbers during McGwire's amazing season drove to 77 last year. After outpacing Roger Maris' 56-second record at home on Sept. 8, McGwire gave a private party of attendance in Cincinnati, Houston and Milwaukee, including an event celebrating the home, wherever he went.

"This will be an incredible experience for our young players," McGwire said in his home on Monday. "This will be the largest crowd they've ever played in front of."

A crowd of 37,000 fans, mostly to opening day, had to wait for some pre-game batting practice in front of the stadium. McGwire hit the first home run in the 10th inning of the opener with a 2-0 lead.

"I had time to play for batting practice at home, because Mark isn't playing," said Showers.

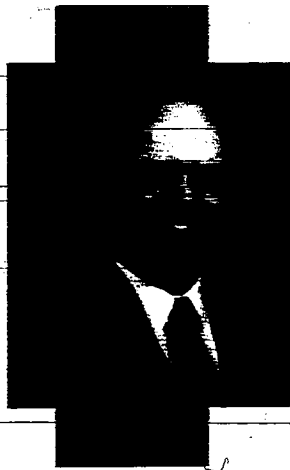
