TWIN FALLS – A white powder spilled on Kimberly Road Monday morning, forcing emergency crews to close the road while a hazardous materials team classed it up. When the clean up ended more than six hours later, the substance was deemed relatively harmless, though further tests will be performed, said Jack Barnes, Twin Falls Fire Department battalion chief and incident commander.

Even if the chemical turns out to be pesticide, it wouldn't have been harmful unless someone is exposed to large amounts, he said.

But emergency crews had no idea what the substance was when it was discovered. No one saw it fall from a vehicle, and it had no packaging or other identifying marks, Barnes said.

That's why police closed the road and called the Emergency Response Team, a hazardous materials team formed with cooperation from six Magic Valley counties.





PITTSBURGH (AP) – Failed Republican presidential candidate John McCain has decided to endorse former rival George W. Bush at their Tuesday summit, despite misgivings about the lecan's agenda, advisers close to McCain said.

The Arizoga senator had been expected to endorse Busil later in the campaign, but determined after a series of events -including a weekend telephone conversation with the presumptive GOP nominee – that he didn't want to wait any longer.







The girlfriend was contacted by investigators and promised to appear later at the investigation headquarters, where she was expected to be arrested, said Federico Opinion, chief of the National Bureau of Investigation headquarters, where she was expected to be arrested, said reduced to the computer opinion, the girlfriend's 23-year-old sister, who also lives in the apartment. The sister recently graduated in computer engineering from the Philippines' AMA Computer College — a school linked by one U.S. computer security firm to the virus.

U.S. computer security firm to the base of the virus has caused a flood of e-mails with the subject line "H.OVEYOU" to course through computer systems in more than 20 countries, overwhelming computer networks. 

Philippine hostages

JOLO, Philippines (AP) – With international pressure for a peaceful resolution growing, the Philippine government showed signs Monday of softening in the face of demands by Muslim separatist rebels holding 21 hostages they grabbed from a diving resort two weeks ago.

President Joseph Estrada said the government has a policy of not paying ransoms, but added, "We are, of course, prepared to consider community development projects in that area."

Government negotiator Nur Misuari, whom the rebels have rejected, will not be replaced, but on the negotiators could be added. The kindnapping is part of a recent wave of violence that has swept the southern Mindanao region, where Muslim guerrillas have spent 28 years fighting for a separate Islamic nation in the mostly Roman Catholic Philippines.

A band of the Abu Sayyaf, the smaller and more extreme of two Muslim rebel-groups in the Philippines, is holding the 21 hostages in the hills of holding Filipinh bestages seized from schools. After clashes, killings and rescues, approximately eight people, mostly charles from schools. On Jolo, four leaders of the Abu Sayyab and sent a letter to Estrada rejecting Misuari, the government's negotiator, and demanding instead to negotiate with the ambassadors from the hostages' countries, Zamora, and representatives of the United Nations, Libya and other Islamic nations.

The rebels have not yet made any concrete demands for the release of the hostages, discussing only the negotiation process.

The hostages consist of three Germans, two French, two South Africans, two Finns, a Lebanese, nine Malaysians and two Filipinos. They were snatched from Sipadun Island, a Malaysian diving resort, two weeks ago and taken ta Jolo, about an hour's boat ride away.





One of those pilot parcels is the South Hills.

At a philosophical level, state management of some federal land seems sound. At a practical level, it's still pretty sketchy.

The South Hills are a multiple-use area, so the idea requires acceptance from multiple users. Some local ranchers are backing the idea, as well as the leader of an off-road vehicle club. That's to be expected, given that disputes over livestock management and off-road vehicle use are hot-button issues these days. Assuming control from Uncle Sam makes sense for these users.

Is Idaho ready to bear those costs? Are the ranchers themselves? Those are hard questions that have yet to receive hard answers.

A process already is in place for management of federal land. It's not a perfect process – after all, this is the U.S. government we're talking about the table process that best serves many people.

Sure, the U.S. Forest Service could stand to streamline its process. Common-sense decisions - such as replacing ineffective cattle guards - should take days, not years. That said, it remains to be shown that the proposed change would be superior to what is already in place.

Agency sees gasoline prices falling through summer

NEW YORK - The U.S. Energy Information Agency said Monday it expects gasoline prices to decline through the summer dri-

ving season.
In its monthly Short-Term
Energy Outlook report, the EIA
predicted that price pressures for
retail gasoline will begin to ease reall gasonne will begin to ease and that average pump prices in most of the U.S. will decline throughout the rest of the year. During the summer driving season, the EIA sees retail gaso-line pump prices in most areas

averaging \$1.40 to \$1.45 a gallon, compared to last month's estimate of \$1.45 to \$1.50.

"It seems the driving season's peak prices are behind us," the ElA said.

The average pump price ationwide, including all grades and taxes, was \$1.5295 per gallon on Friday, according to the Lundberg Survey of 10,000 gasoline stations released on Sunday. That compares with the year's high of \$1.60 reached on March 24.

could top \$2.00 per barrel by summer due to soaring oil prices and increased demand.

But oil prices have fallen significantly following the decision by the Organization of Petroleum Exporting Countries in late March to increase output. That decision followed a series of production cuts that sent prices from nineyear lows at the start of 1999 to more than \$34.00 a barrel in March this year-a level not seen since the Gulf War of 1991.

Despite the general fall in retail gasoline prices, prices in Callifornia this summer could be

higher than the U.S. average owing to current tight supplies of gasoline there that meet California Air Resources Board (CARB) specifications. "California State law requires a cleaner, costiler type of gasoline," the EIA report said. "Tight supplies of this special fuel have boosted spot prices for motor gasoline by over 20 cents per galion in the last few weeks. Unless these spot prices head back down soon, consumers in California will be seeing fairly robust price hikes at the pump over the next few months."
