GOP officials: Craig will resign today

BOISE — Idaho Republican Sen. Larry Craig will resign from the Senate amid a furor over his arrest and guilty plea in a police sex sting in an airport men's room, Republican officials said

Friday. Craig will announce at a news

conference in Boise this morning that he will resign effective Sept. 30. GOP officials in Idaho and Washington told The Associated Press, speaking on condition of anonymity. Word of the resignation came four days after the disclosure that Craig had pleaded guilty to a reduced misdemeanor charge arising out of his June 11 arrest

senator had maintained that he
did nothing wrong except for
making the guilty plea without
consulting a lawyer. But he found
almost no support among
Republicans in his home state or
Washington.

When South shows his strong

When South shows his strong no-trump and good trump support, North takes a shot at a heart stam. This would be entirely unjustified were it not for the difficulty of exploring for slam with this hand, and for West's natural lead of a spade. Can you take advantage of your good fortune?

If you ruff West's lead and then draw trumps while eliminating the spades, the best you can hope for is to find the hand with three diamonds having two or fewer clubs. You could then throw him in with the third diamond to give you a ruff and discard. Today, however, would not be your lucky day, and your chances of success from following this line are not exactly healthy.

Still, it is hard to see how discarding a club from dummy could create any pressure in the endgame. You lose the first trick, and now have 11 top tricks, but need an unlikely minor-suit squeeze to bring the contract home.
