

### CANAL BOARD RETAINED AT ANNUAL MEETING

Resolutions Aimed at Solicitation of Proxies, Long Terms for Directors Cause Discussion

Adopting four resolutions—two of which were subjected to close scrutiny—and electing a slate of five directors, stockholders of the Twin Falls Canal Company closed their annual meeting here last night.

Shares of stock valued at 660,000, 666,666 shares of stock during balloting period during the afternoon and into the evening, and tabulations by company officials showed the following results: John Thomas, Caldwell, 115,414; N. W. Shatt, Boise, 110,075; Peter Link, Boise, 110,075; Don Bradford, Twin Falls, 155,430; H. S. Simpson, represented 39,735, and votes representing 1,282,404 shares of stock were not counted.

The total vote exceeded 1940's 40,800,300, but was less than the high of 1938's 27,000,000 for 1939.

With H. E. Sweeney, county controller, acting as temporary chairman, the annual meeting opened at 7:30 p. m. and Gordon Gray, district reporter as secretary presided over the session.

Nominations were offered from the floor and other business transacted. Resolutions were presented by officials, to clear the way for discussion and adoption of resolutions in the afternoon.

Following presentation by committee chairman J. P. Corcoran of a resolution that the committee be discontinued, Judge J. R. Bohlen, county attorney, stated that, if interpreted as an attempt to eliminate proxies, the resolution would be voted against.

Members of the resolutions committee indicated that the committee had not had time to prepare a resolution for proxies, and that it was recommended that an effort to increase attendance at stockholders' meetings.

The complete resolutions, as amended, follow:

### THE WASTE CHARGED TO LEGISLATURE

BOISE, Jan. 14.—Idaho's 20th legislature heard charges of "time-wasting" today but managed to chalk up some progress in its law-making program.

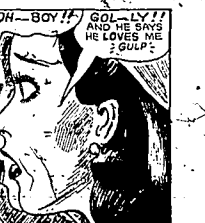

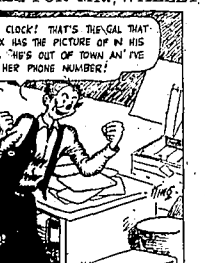
