



# A PARTY RESPONSIBILITY Washington dispatches report a rising demand in congress for modernization of anti-quated features of the federal diseal system. If this demand reaches a point where action

If this demand reaches a point where action results, it will be a blessing.

The basic fault of the present system is that expenditures and provisions for financing them are dealt with in coheress as two utterly unrelated subjects. The President annually submits to congress estimates of receipts and expenditures for the ensuing fiscal year. This is a budget, but as soon as congress tacks over its character as a budget is lost, and never recovered.

Congress merely makes appropriations.

is iost, and never recovered.

Congress merely makes appropriations, which may or may not foliow the executive estimates. Congress does not simultaneously yote financing for the appropriations. Worse than that, it never votes on the aggregate amount of the appropriations but only on a series of sparatie billis—the war department bill, the independent offices bill, and so forth.

If the expenditures thus multiorized exceed evenues and a defect results at year's-end, congress takes no responsibility for it. Netther does any individual congressman, since he can always explain that expenditures he sup-ported were not the ones that made the def-

can always explain that expenditures he supported were not the ones that made the deflett.

It is not too much to say that under this odd system, nobody really is accountable for the budget, the most important single act of government. The president can binne congress for any extravagance that results; congress the remedies. Congress should deal with the budget as a unit, accepting responsibility or any excess of expenditures over estimated revenues. The president's responsibility about not end with his dirafting and submitting of a proposed budget. He should have power to veto, not alone whole bills, which in practice never is done, but individual appropriations that exceed this estimates.

Such a bystem would fasten the responsibility for fiscal management securely on the political party controlling the government. The difficulty is to get it adopted. Most congressmen anuch prefer the present system.
