Democrats Push Through Administration Measures; House Votes to Abolish Liquor Control Board

(By The Associated Press) BOISE, Jan. 24 - Ignoring minority pleas that their action would contravene the state constitution, Democrats in the Idaho senate pushed through today three administration measures that would transfer most of the present duties of state tax commissioners to the commissioners of finance and law enforcement.

Two of the bills already approved by the house and more controversial than the third, passed 21-19, with Ambrose (R-Clatsop) joined with Edmonds (D-Ontario) and Robinson (D-Benewah) joined with Mason (D-Shoshone).

The vote was on strict party lines. One of the disputed measures transfers collection of the chain liquor license tax, the transfer and inheritance tax and a levy on express companies, to the finance commission.

The other gives the commissioner of law enforcement jurisdiction over the alcohol and performs its duties, but not its powers. The third measure, to reorganize the state auditor, secretary of state and the department of agriculture, was approved unanimously.

A fourth bill, to make the finance commissioner collector of state income tax, is yet to be debated by the senate but has been approved by the house.

Liquor Bill Passes In the house another controversial administration bill, that to abolish the state liquor control board and transfer its duties to perform its duties, was passed 28-25 after an hour and a half debate.

With Republican leaders joining Democrats in forming it "a good bill," the measure was passed 28-25 after an hour and a half debate.

Senators Goff (R-Latah) and Williams (D-Bingham) led the Republican fight against the measure, while the Democrats were led by Heath (R-Franklin), Harlow (R-Cassia), Gifford (R-Teton), Hill (D-Ontario) and Barnum (D-Cooking).

Graziana Abandons Cirene Under Heavy British Fire

Motorized Units, Airmen Ranging About Derna

(By The Associated Press) CAIRO, Jan. 24 - General Rodolfo Graziani, commander of Italy's army in Libya, was reported tonight to have abandoned his headquarters at Cirene, 50 miles west of Derna, apparently under heavy bombardment by British airmen. With two-thirds of his effectives and the considerably greater proportion of his equipment lost in the Egyptian-Libyan campaign to date, Marshal Graziani quit Cirene for a spot near Derna, where he is expected to be replaced by British bombers in the night.

This was the first indication of the exact whereabouts of Graziani since the British began their African offensive. British motorized units and airmen have been reported about and beyond Derna, 95 miles west of captured Tripoli.

RUMANIANS HUNT REBEL CHIEFTAIN

Troops Ordered to Bring in Leader and Outthroat Associates

(By The Associated Press) BUCHAREST, Jan. 24 - The Iron Guard rebels fighting the government of Gen. Ion Antonescu in Rumania, was the object today of a widespread hunt by Rumanian troops ordered to bring him and his associates back to military tribunals.

A reliable informant reaching Bucharest from the chief Bucharest rebel, said that the Iron Guard rebels had fled to the mountains of the Carpathians, where they were hiding out in small groups. He said that the Iron Guard rebels had been reduced to a few hundred men.

Other rebel units were reported holding out at Ploesti, Arad and Constanta. Bucharest was said to be comparatively quiet. Detailed details of the Rumanian outbreak drew a picture of a city of terror, of heavy firing in the heart of the city, of many deaths, of the summary execution of Jews in the basements of their own homes.

Roosevelt Dashes to Sea To Greet Britain's Envoy; War Aid Bill Draws Fire

Roosevelt Seen as Potential Dictator Over Britain and United States

(By The Associated Press) WASHINGTON, Jan. 24 - William B. Castle, who was President Hoover's undersecretary of state, told the house foreign affairs committee today that the pending war aid bill would make President Roosevelt a dictator over Britain as well as the United States.

"Through his control of the supplies flowing out from what he pleases for this 'present of democracy,' he would become supreme in all military matters, British as well as American," Castle said.

Thus, he asserted, Mr. Roosevelt could dominate Britain as long as the war lasted.

"At home, congress would be impotent and in Britain, far, rather than supreme, would be the British government to the feet of the American president."

Army, Navy News Castle testified before the Democrats and Republicans on the committee charged "castles" with proposals to take testimony from army and navy leaders. While Republicans charged "castles" with the Democratic majority declined to hear the officers in private next Monday.

The action was taken after Representative Fish (R-NY) had invited them to testify publicly so that, he asserted, the nation could learn whether Col. Charles A. Lindbergh was correct when he said that he has only several hundred modern combat planes.

Meanwhile, President Roosevelt, asked at his press conference about reports that he would not object to pledging limits on the life of the bill and its grant of power, declined to give an opinion. He said that he would wait at least until he saw the measure as finally approved by the committee.

Congressional Approval On the senate side, the assistant Senator Austin (R-Vt), capitalist business leader, told reporters he approved a proposal to require that the president receive congressional approval before granting aid to any "warring democracy."

Austin said it now was "premature" to discuss writing into the bill a prohibition against American consuls for ships to Great Britain. "This is a matter of strategy," he said.

New Legislation Hikes Debt Limit

WASHINGTON, Jan. 24 - Chairman Doughton (D-Conn.) of the house ways and means committee introduced legislation today to raise the federal debt limit to \$40,000,000,000. The current debt is \$42,769,927,777.

Doughton announced that public hearings on the measure would start Wednesday with Secretary Morgenthau as the first witness.

The measure also would remove the present limitation of \$4,000,000,000 on the amount of new indebtedness for national defense. That sum was "enormous" last year when congress boosted the limit upward from \$45,000,000,000.

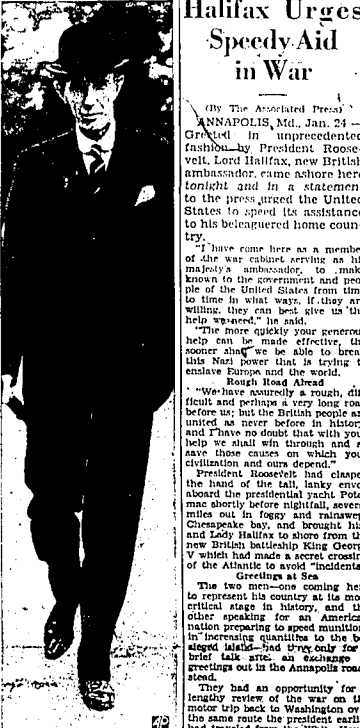

ORDER RECALLS SOUTHWARD TRIAL

District Judge Authorizes Destruction of Murder Case Exhibits

A number of placards containing human skulls that were introduced in evidence at the trial of Southard in Twin Falls, convicted nearly 20 years ago of poison slaying of her fourth husband, will be destroyed under terms of an order which Judge James W. Foster signed last week.

Applying for the order for destruction of the exhibits, Prosecutor Attorney General Mr. Swann said there is no further use for them.

Human skulls were taken from the graves of the man Mrs. Southard was convicted of slaying and of three previous husbands she was alleged to have put to death with poison. Analyses were made by state chemists of Utah and Idaho.

The exhibits have been stored in a room in the state penitentiary at Pocatello since the trial in November, 1921.

Mrs. Southard was found guilty of second degree murder and sentenced to a term of 20 years to life in the state penitentiary.

She was brought back from Colorado after a successful attempt to escape some years ago.

There has been an applicant for leniency at successive sessions of the state pardon board.

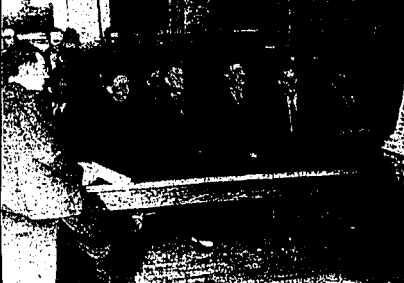

STATES ASK TO HANDLE RELIEF

WASHINGTON, Jan. 24 (AP)—The congress of states government today requested that administration of relief be turned over to the states with the federal government contributing up to 75 per cent of the cost.

A resolution adopted by the committee generally assumed that the federal government would contribute up to 75 per cent of the cost of relief in other states. It was suggested that federal grants for relief range from 50 per cent of total cost in richer states to 75 per cent in poorer states.

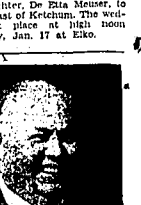

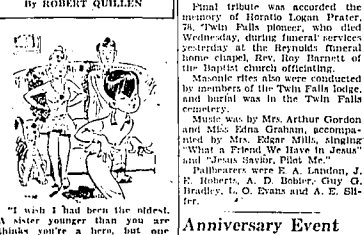
