TELL GROWNUPS FIRST
Under the changing conditions of modern times even the oldest questions become new and interesting. It is unethical to tell children that is Santa Claus, Dr. Ernest Burton Skaggs, professor of psychology at Wayne State University, has recently been asked to answer that question, long before Dr. Skaggs became a professor.

Generations passed, but Santa Claus sticks in the mind and the next generation of faker still troubles the consciences of scrupulously minded people. There are a lot of college students who still think there is a Santa Claus. Dr. Skaggs told his class, "and they should be glad that there is not a Santa Claus."

"You want to build a new highway?" Uncle Sam asks the simpleminded citizen. Here, take this hundred million dollars. And say, Farmer, never mind planting all that wheat and corn, here's a billion dollars. That'll take care of you and save you a lot of trouble.

But intelligent people like Mr. Skaggs and others know that Uncle Sam hasn't any cash except what he gets out of taxpayers' pockets. That stark, naked truth ought to be taught to the young mind, not in a book or magazine, but in the whole system of adult education.

MAKING BEAUTY "WORK"
To give a greater popular appeal to the Metropolitan Museum of Art and thereby increase its usefulness is the ambition of the new 37-year-old director, Francis Henry Taylor.

There the similarity ends. The trend in art is liable to find this world-renowned art collection depressing rather than stimulating because he is bewildered by the many displays.
