Jaycees Defeat Elks in Second Overtime Period

Northsiders Decision Burley Cagers, 47 to 41, After Thrilling Clash Before Big Crowd

GOODING, Feb. 1 — Two brilliant, hard-playing basketball clubs battled through the championship game and two overtime periods before the Gooding outlaw tournament title and \$100 first prize money went to the Jerome Jaycees for their 47 to 41 victory over the Burley Elks. The Jaycees, first team from Jerome to annex the crown since 1929, trailed Burley, 1940 titleholder, by a 15-19 count at the half. A thrilling battle for points the two clubs were denuded at 37-all at the end of the regular playing time.

In the first overtime period Burley started the on two field goals by Elmer Edgington, but Jerome soon knifed the score with shots by Ralph Pink and Fred Croy. Ten seconds remained when Cincy Hollibaugh missed a free throw. The classic quarter went scoreless in the second extra period when the Northsiders' Croy and Hollibaugh each connected to give the Jaycees the game by a six-point margin.

Fourth Game For Burley it was the fourth contest of the day, Jerome advanced to the finals by downing the Elks in a non-final class. Jerome's Croy and Norby of Jerome chinked up 15 points to capture top honors in the game while Croy led the losers by 12.

He managed the Oklahoman City club until the following year, and in 1939 managed their Portsmouth club of the Piedmont league. He came back to Oklahoman City as a manager in 1940 but was replaced in mid-season by Rogers Hornsby.

Keesey, a power hitter, asked for his free agency and was granted it this winter. He has been playing in Portland, Ore. MOSCOW, Idaho, Feb. 1 (AP) — The special committee appointed by President Harrison C. Dale to study the University of Idaho's athletic situation went into a huddle today and planned "to emerge tomorrow with nothing to report — for publication."

Dean T. S. Kerr, chairman of the faculty-student-athletic committee, said the group would "make our report to the president and trustees."

The committee was named after Albert E. Dierich, head coach and Assistant Football Coach Bob Tossie were released and basketball coach Forrest D. Woodard resigned last month.

The committee would recommend reorganization of the athletic directorship from the position of head football coach to head basketball coach when one commitment, which declined to be quoted, said a director could be chosen first and consulted about coaching changes if the position was to be separated.

The same source said the committee was strongly of the opinion that reorganization for the coaching positions were less important than the planning of a sound athletic reorganization.

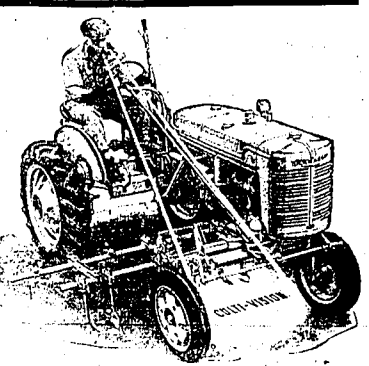

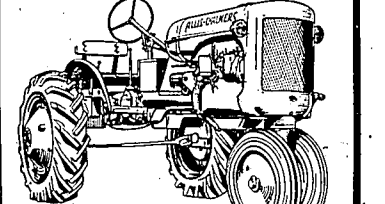
