Weather conditions of the Irish coast offer the obvious explanation. They tend to make the timing of British shipping, even of big convoys, a matter of chance for Nazi aircraft and submarines. The Germans appear to be stumbling upon their shipping victims rather than finding them out by any systematic method.

Britain is using Atlantic lanes every day to the fullest possible extent for her available cargo shipping, she must be straining every nerve to make the most of winter conditions to stock England with food reserves and other essentials against what may be coming in spring.

No figures are available on the total overseas tonnage reaching English ports every day or week. They would throw a flood of light on the question of British ability to stand virtual siege by air and sea. It cannot be doubted, however, that the flow of essentials from overseas into England is right now at its peak for the winter season and craft use the sea in all weather and during night or day. The fact that winter came before Germany was prepared to strike decisively at England not only saved the island from invasion, but gave it an invaluable reason in which to store up supplies.

STUDY MADE OF VOTING DISTRICTS

Idaho Population Equitably Distributed Between Two Congressional Units

WASHINGTON, Feb. 4.—The population of Idaho is equitably distributed between the two congressional districts according to a study of congressional apportionment by L. F. Schmeckeler, just published by the Brookings Institution. Compared with the average for the population of the first district, the second district is 14.5 per cent below and the second is 13.5 per cent above. Twenty per cent is considered an allowable deviation from the average.

The study reveals inequities in the distribution of representation in 20 states. They have been caused, some instances by "gerrymandering" districts; in others by simple failure to effect redistricting because of political considerations, and in others by the natural disposition to divide a county between two districts. Except in the metropolitan areas, district boundaries generally follow county lines, although few states have constitutional provisions requiring this. Urban districts, as a rule, have greater population than rural ones, which means that their residents have less representation per capita.
