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## SENATE KILLS 4-YEAR TERM FOR GOVERNOR

BOISE, Feb. 12.—Two resolutions proposing constitutional amendments to provide for four-year tenure of elective state officials and legislators were defeated in the Idaho senate today. They were kept alive at least until tomorrow on notices of reconsideration.

The house of representatives meantime, by a 40 to 15 vote, decided to override a veto by Governor Frank O. Whitely. The measure requires the commissioner of liquor to revoke the license of any retailer convicted of selling whisky or other hard liquor.

"From our questioning of Avery and his wife," Hawkins said, "we have found no evidence to indicate that any other persons, besides the two, involved in the crime."

LOWER SPUD RATE FOR IDAHO ASKED

Railroad Representatives Take Governor's Request Under Advisement

BOISE, Feb. 12 (AP)—A proposal by Governor Clark and others that freight rates on Idaho potatoes be reduced approximately 25 per cent was under advisement today by railroad representatives tonight after a day-long hearing.

The hearing was called by the governor in an effort to find a rate for approximately 16,000 carloads of potatoes still being held in storage depots in the state.

Attending were representatives of the Idaho potato growers' association, the Idaho Grange, federal crop stabilizers, commissioner of agriculture, chairman of the house of representatives committee, and railroad freight agents and representatives.

Idaho's staple crop of potatoes and market prices were explained by the committee. It is a member of the Idaho Growers and Shippers' association, who declared that more emergency action should be taken immediately or Idaho potato growers stand to lose thousands of dollars.

The price Idaho farmers are receiving for potatoes now is 30 cents a hundred, exclusive of freight. It costs 94 cents a hundred to produce them. At this rate it won't be long before the main crop of Idaho will be completely forgotten.

Idaho has 24 years operation of farm-to-market roads. Farmers who raise potatoes are discriminated against. Nothing can be done and it must be done soon.

Commissioner of Agriculture William H. Stewart said that Governor Clark said the proposed final plan called for diversion into stock feed of 120,000 bushels of Idaho potatoes in 1941.

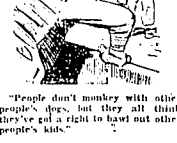

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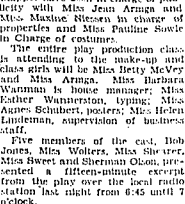
