FEDERAL RULE SEEN AS OUT FOR BUSINESS

Woolson Senator Recommends Government Charter, National Corporations To Save Free Enterprise

(By The Associated Press) WASHINGTON, March 11—Chairman O'Mahoney (D-Wyo.) told the monopoly committee today that the only way to avoid "continued expansion of government debt and the continued expansion of government control over private business" was to require incorporation of national business under federal law.

National charters for national corporations was one of O'Mahoney's recommendations proposed by O'Mahoney for inclusion in the final report of the committee, which is preparing to wind up a study of nearly three years' length. He recommended also:

The effective and thorough enforcement of laws which have to maintain competition and to prevent all combinations and agreements that destroy business.

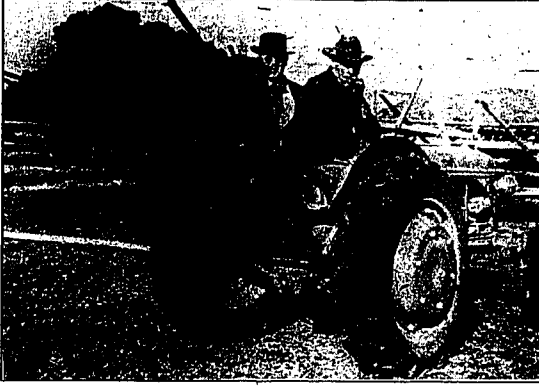
The encouragement of new business units and enterprises by revision of the tax laws for the purpose of encouraging new employment and industry.

A national conference called by the Federal Reserve board, representatives of business, labor, agriculture and consumers to discuss the future of the Federal Reserve in order to "concentrate public thought and action on the objectives on which there is general agreement."

In order to encourage development of small business, O'Mahoney said he favored a system of privately insured loans, rather than make the government the source of needed capital.

WASHINGTON, March 11 — In a breath-taking burst of speed, congress rushed the lease-lend bill to the White House today. President Roosevelt signed it, and four minutes later ordered an undisclosed list of war materials sent to England and Greece.

The speed started at that point Vice President Wallace bustling out of the house and the capitol and the Speaker Rayburn signed it. Chairman Keown (D-Ohio) of the labor committee on enrolled bills, rushed to the White House in a taxi.

Mr. Roosevelt was waiting at his desk at 2:31. British House of commons immediately notified that the bill had been signed, with the measure signed in his hand, that the measure would come into force.
