He said that such a remark was unjustified, and that he would support a tax measure.

He thanked the senator for saying that, Connally said, "I deliberately brought this bill in to get records because this bill is going to jerk some people out of their boots."

3. The two-week old CIO strike at the Midland Steel Products company, in Detroit, for abolition of piece work forced the Ford Motor Company's Lincoln plant to close yesterday for lack of automobile frames and chassis.

4. Work on more than \$500,000,000 of new and pipe fittings urgently needed by the navy was suspended yesterday when CIO employees walked out at the Walworth Manufacturing company in Boston in a dispute over recognition and higher wages.

On the other hand: The Harvill Die Casting Corp., Los Angeles, which supplies materials for aircraft making, has been hit by a CIO strike for recognition, wage increases and other demands, and work was resumed immediately.
