Only for the purpose of clarifying a misunderstanding that may have arisen in the public mind as a result of statements made during the past two years, do Paul R. Taber and Leonard Ayant, present councilmen and candidates for re-election, wish to make an open explanation.

The unfair charge has been made that the present city council, including these two members who are running on the ticket with Lem A. Chapin, candidate for mayor, has made it impossible for the incumbent mayor to carry out his program because of so-called "opposition of the council."

Mr. Taber and Mr. Avant wish to emphasize the fact that only on relatively few occasions have they opposed the present mayor, and in those instances they believed they were doing so in the best interests of the city.

They did oppose installation of parking meters in Twin Falls for the reason they believed the people generally disapproved of such devices. They objected to the mayor's attempt to oust Police Chief Howard

-Gillette because they believed, and still do, that Mr. Gillette is perhaps the best police executive the city has ever had.

They did oppose the mayor's original annexation proposal in connection with the low cost housing program, for the logical reason that people living in the neighborhood in question strahuously objected to such an annexation.

The mayor's more recent proposal for denying Twin Falls the right, through legislative enactment, to continue with its present form of city government, rather than permit the city to make its own decision in that respect, was also opposed by these councilment. .

Other than such opposition, which Mr. Taber and Mr. Avant Balleve the people of Twin Falls will uphold, these men have not opposed the present mayor in any way, and particularly have not objected to any of his proposed improvements. In most instances, the mayor has not co sulted the council regarding such improvements, and is solely responsible for his record in this respect.


