BLAST DESTROYS CHEMICAL PLANT

One Man Killed, 14 Injured In Explosion at Portland

PORTLAND, Ore., March 25 (AP)—A manufacturing plant here was destroyed today by a blast that killed one man and injured 14 other persons.

Fire Marshal Fred Marzani said the explosion apparently originated in a mixing machine of the R. N. Chipman company and that no indication of sabotage has been found.

The plant, drawn to this area by Bonneville power, recently began production of zinc chloride primarily used as a preservative for metal parts. It was converted to the manufacture of chemical products in 1938.

Among seven Chipman employees injured was Ralph Chipman, 60, owner of the plant and its chief manager, severe head and back injuries. Three other employees were injured, including one who was killed.

CLARK DEMANDS TAX-ON LIQUOR

Distillers Reported Threatening to Refuse to Sell to Idaho

BOISE, March 25 (AP)—Amid persistent reports a 20 per cent tax on the wholesale price would not be collected from distillers selling liquor to Idaho Governor Clark threatened today his determination to make sure the levy is paid.

Million-Dollar Levy—The levy, only now to be passed by the 20th legislative session, was expected to raise approximately \$1,000,000 during the biennium to go into the state's general fund.

Liquor wholesalers ship their products to designated warehouses in Idaho where it is withdrawn upon purchase orders from liquor distributors.

Miller's Surrender—In his opinion, Miller suggested the following method of paying the tax: "A revolving fund should be set up by the board of examiners, and the time the liquor is withdrawn from the distilling plant the amount of the tax in favor of the state treasurer and deliver the same to the general fund of liquor distributors."

Clark's Decision—Clark has decided to accept the 20 per cent tax on the wholesale price of liquor and the tax on the retail price of liquor.
