### GAS RATION HAZARD

Most of the contemplation of proposed gas oline rationing takes into account the inconvenience to millions of Americans and over-looks a potent factor in fiscal affairs—the re-venue yielded by gasoline consumption.

Secretary Ickes wants to curtuil gasoline consumption in the Atlantic states by one-third. The eighteen state governments and the District of Columbia collected in gasoline levies last year \$345,189,00, the taxes ranging from three to.seven cents per gallon! A one-third reduction in sales-would mean loss of revenue of more than \$100,000,000. New York-alone collects \$73,000,000 from gasoline levies and Pennsylvania takes \$63,000,000 annually.


