

Roosevelt Pledges Nation's Full Part In Hitler's Defeat

President, in Labor Day Address, Calls for Increased Production, Delivery of War Munitions

HYDE PARK, N. Y., Sept. 1.—Reminding his fellow Americans of their constant readiness to fight for their rights, President Roosevelt declared today that "it must do our full part" in conquering "forces of insane violence" led loose by Adolf Hitler.

"There has never been a moment in our history," he said in a broadcast Labor-day address, "when Americans were not ready to stand up as free men and fight for their rights."

"The fundamental rights of Americans, established by their forefathers on the field of battle, are threatened, he warned, by Hitler's violent attempt to crush the world."

"Not-Yet-Enough!" The president spoke of the increasing production of munitions and the pressing industries; but asserted that "our American effort has not been big enough" and called for additional steps to guarantee delivery of weapons and war equipment overseas but not in domestic specific methods.

"Once more he scorned the doctrine of appeasement. Appeasement and non-sympathizers, he asserted, have done little to bring Hitler's aggression to a halt."

"I reject it again. I do not know that I speak the conscience and determination of the American people. I do not know that I shall do everything in our power to crush Hitler and his Nazi forces."

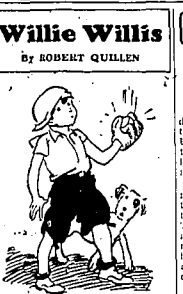

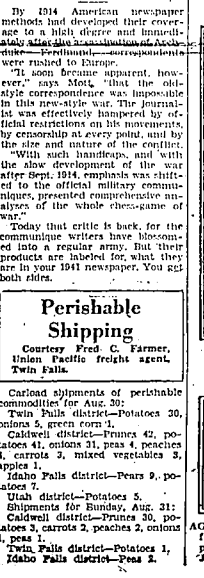

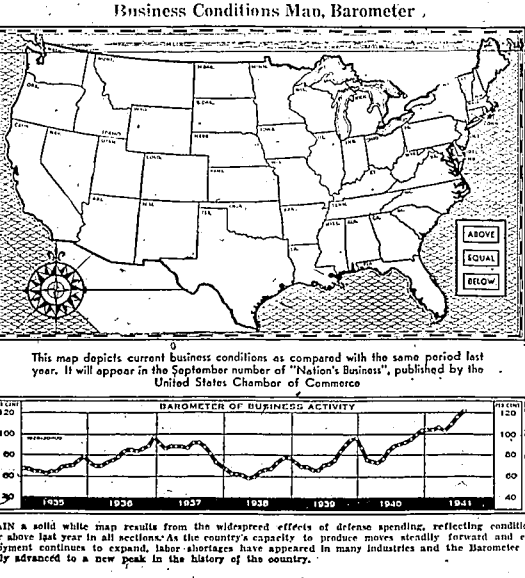
