The president's veto of the cotton and wheat surplus freezing act was expected. In fact, it may have been counted on from the day that congress found that it had to yield to the farm lobby.

The reserve stocks of these two crops, on which the government has lent money, are sufficient to supply the country for about a year. Wheat and corn growers argued rightly that these reserves depress the price of the current year's crop. Their plan was to freeze the reserves until after the emergency.

The president pointed out in his veto message that the growers should be satisfied with parity prices—which have been relieved he region to the proper should be antisted with parity prices—which have been relieved he refrect, he stood off the farm drive to get the money while the getting is good. THE FOOD PICTURE

Officials of the bureau of labor statistics are presenting a picture of the future of food prices which is not precisely comforting to the safaried man whose income is more or less static. static. nsumers, who are spending about \$2,000.

Consumers, who are spending about \$2.000, -000,000 more for food this year than last year, have thus far noticed little pinching of the family larder. For one thing, wages in many fields have advanced even more rapidly than prices. But retail food prices are expected now to advance/fixer than they did list spring when the increase was nearly 4 per cent from the middle of May to the middle of June.

of June. Commodities on which prices are expected to rise the most rapidly are coffee, beans, lard, butter, cheeke, eggs, bacon and ham. The bureau has-graphs showing that the retail prices of these foods have lagged far behind wholesale prices and service costs. Wholesale lard prices, for example, have risen 70 per cent in the last year while retail prices are up-only 35 per cent. Wholesale coffee price is up 70 per cent and the retail price only 11 per cent higher than a year ago. Average retail quotations of 65 major food items

bureau survey shows while wholesale prices of the same items have advanced 25 per cent in the same period. Most of the extra \$2,000,000,000 for food

Most of the extra \$2,000,000,000 for food this year is expected to be spent by defense wage earners whose incomes are sharply higher. Salaried workers whose incomes are more or less static will not eat less but they are expected to reduce the quality of their purchases somewhat. 




