

The Vidor H. Kelly is in Pacific Coast service. The L. P. St. Clair has been sent to Vladivostok by order of the U. S. Government. This means that the Union Dil Company has contributed five tankers to the ware flort and only gained back one. Generally speaking, the same thing is true of other Pacific Coast companies.


