Roosevelt's Signature on Revenue Bill Boosts U.S. Levies to Record High

(By The Associated Press) WASHINGTON, Sept. 20—With President Roosevelt's sig-nature, the \$3,553,400,000 revenue bill became law today and the federal tax load mounted to record-breaking proportions.
