# MOSCOW PERILED BY KIEV'S FALL

### German Forces in Position to Strike Heavy Blows on Two Fronts

With the fall of Kiev, inevitably admitted from Moscow, German forces encircling the lost city are in a position to strike menacing blows against the Russians not only southward toward the Donets-Don basin but northward toward Moscow.

Their advance across the Dnieper River defense line, running from Kiev to Bryansk, has merged the central and south-central fighting fronts into one vast battle. It could as gravely threaten the Soviet capital as the Donets-Don basin or even Rostov on the Don.

Berlin and Moscow versions of the fighting east of Kiev do little to indicate the exact plight of Red armies there, which are estimated to number close to half a million men. Berlin pictures 30 Red divisions completely encircled and in "total annihilation." Moscow says they are fighting their way through a gap in the German lines to reach Kharkov for a new stand.

There is some evidence that there is a gap between the jaws of the pincers, German vice, which is all but closed east of Kiev. However, it is clear that a dangerous rent is being torn in Moscow's defense front southeast of the Russian-Soviet Simonsk salient. Presumably the Germans have again reached Bryansk Junction. If so they are in a position to push on toward Moscow, outflanking the Russian Simonsk salient.

There is great danger that contact between Russian armies in the Simonsk sector and those which may escape southward toward Kharkov from the Kiev pocket might be broken, forcing hurried Russian retreat, all the way from Smolensk southward to the sea of Azov. That would mean retirement on a front of nearly 1000 miles.

It remains to be seen, however, whether the Germans themselves can muster sufficient forces to undertake so huge a double attack simultaneously. Weather probabilities of the immediate future as well as other considerations make the Donets-Don basin and Rostov still the most logical objectives of the smashing German offensive, not Moscow.

## Two-Way Radio To Come Soon; Power Boosted

With a boost to 100 watts assuring county-wide law enforcement radio coverage, the Twin Falls police department is now awaiting arrival of a needed part before installation of two-way radio equipment, officials announced last night.

The system, recently incorporated with Twin Falls county sheriff's radios in three cars, was formerly operating with the transmitter at 50 watts, but it has now been stepped up to the maximum of 100 watts.

The station, KFDZ, is now hooked up with two city cars, and these will be placed on a two-way basis as a part of the project, which was shipped yesterday from the east.
