NEW TAX LAW

Highlighting the new tax law, devised to yield an additional revenue of \$3,500,000,000 for the federal government, are the lowering of individual income tax exemptions and imposing aurtaxes beginning with the first an exaction of not less than 10 ager cent on any net income and as the result of the exemption reduction 2,275,000 more persons will pay an income tax next year. So much for the direct taxes payable next year, but nearly everybody, regardless of extrings, will almost immediately be made aware of additional costs through increased exclast taxes. A great deal has been said in disparagement of the morale of the army, its equipment and training. The simple truth of the matter is that the transformation of the nation's military establishment during the last year represents something in the nature of a military miracle.

Little more than a year ago the First army maneuvers in upper New York were staged by 100,000 untrained and poorly equipped civilian soldiers. Worse, the nation's three other field armies were similarly and generally untrained and ill equipped.




