

Losses Mount as Tropical Storm Strikes Houston

Hurricane Hurls Fury Against Texas Coast, Causing Two Deaths and \$1,700,000 Property Damage

HOUSTON, Tex., Sept. 23.—Houston, Texas' largest city, last night was at the very center of the most powerful tropical hurricane to strike against the Texas coast this afternoon between Matagorda and Freeport.

In the wake of the 60 to 100 mile an hour winds at least two persons were dead and property damage was estimated to be at least \$1,700,000.

The United States weather bureau said the storm would lose its intensity "soon" as it curved to the northeast after sweeping in along a 45 mile stretch between Freeport and Matagorda.

Although reports trickled in that some unreported communications damage was heavy along the coast, especially to crops, from two sections of the rice-growing country squarely in the storm's path—the Alvin and the unincorporated town of Guadalupe county officials estimated \$1,700,000 damage done to rice.

Telegraphic communication with Beaumont and Galveston was cut off by the storm. Two fatalities were reported—a seaman who was swept overboard by the waves in the Gulf of Mexico, and a child who was killed by a falling tree in the Houston area.

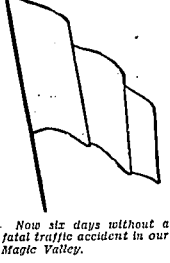

Herds tested totaled 41 and there were 679 cows in the association. Total pounds of 568 milk and 45,982 in milk and 18,022.6 butterfat. Average percentage of butterfat, per cow, including those that were dry, was 67, while butterfat averaged 26.5.
