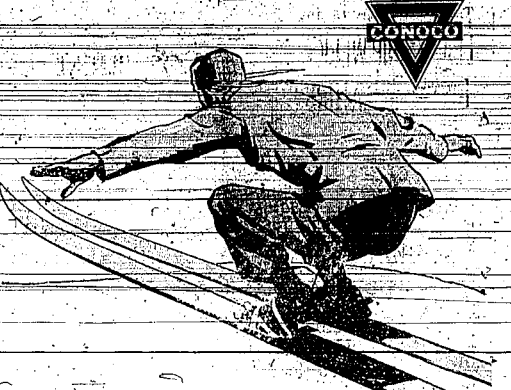

PROHIBITION'S ANNIVERSARY

TOMORROW, January 16 is the eleventh anniversary of the inauguration of national prohibition of liquor. Like other anniversaries, the event is worthy of special consideration.

Through this eleven years the prohibition question has been a great national problem, but no more so than it is today, what with the Wickersham committee report about ready, the transfer of the enforcement work from the Treasury department to the Department of Justice, the increased enforcement appointments from congress and the vigor which has been brought to this enforcement by Commissioner Woodcock, aside from the great and increased public interest in prohibition as a national policy.

The outstanding fact to be considered in all discussion and conclusions regarding liquor prohibition, enforcement and the law, and any issue generally is that the people of any given community, state or nation, generally get in the end the kind of government which the people of that community or state or nation want.

Now this is not always or necessarily true, but broadly considered, it is true. For instance the people of Kansas, traditionally dry, look askance at New York's state, and wonder at the lack of enforcement, whereas it is perhaps true that New York and Kansas are both getting the kind of government (enforcement) which the majority of the people of those states want and demand.

If the Wickersham report should state, as is predicted, that the lack of enforcement in this country is to be laid at the door of local and state law enforcement officials, then it is only fair to those officials to add that they are doubtless giving the people the kind of enforcement which they want and will stand for.

And this is also true that it is either a black mark on the record of the United States, that the people do not stand for better prohibition enforcement, or else it is patent that prohibition does not meet with anything like the unanimous public favor given laws in general.

Either contingency gives a serious result which well might be contemplated on this eleventh anniversary of national prohibition.

THE LUCAS FRAGS

IT IS NOT THE FACT of Robert H. Lucas's effort to defeat Senator Norris of Nebraska that has caused the country to look askance at that dignitary of the Republican National organization for the surprising quality of his enterprise and the material he used in making his undercover campaign.

There may be an ethical question as to the righteousness of an official of the Republican National Committee engaging in an attempt to nullify the will of the Republican party of the State of Nebraska because it is the general impression that the duties of a national political organization bind it to the support of its party's nominees. It is quite evident that Executive Director Lucas realized this, because he carefully avoided doing the thing openly and when he was caught at it made the excuse that his enmity against Senator Norris was made in his personal and not in his official capacity.

The Republican National Chairman, Senator Pess, had announced that the organization would aid in the election of every Republican candidate, regardless as well as Regulars.

Perhaps it is barely within the limits of permissible conduct for the chief officer of the Executive Committee of a great party to do political things in controversy of that party's official declarations, but that does not remove the incident of the viciousness of circulating literature secretly, and covering up responsibility of the forgery, by invoking an incident having source and paying the costs in cash so as to avoid leaving in the trail of a check.

Neither the Ku Klux circulars nor the lack letter did Senator Norris any harm, but that merely emphasizes the inefficiency of the performance, and takes nothing away from the motive and method of the Executive Director of the Republican National Committee. He told the Nye Committee that he obtained the massive, which was on the letter-head of a non-existent Democratic organization, from John M. Pettors of Omaha. Of course, the Nye Committee could find no John M. Pettors either at the address given or elsewhere in Omaha.

Nor did Mr. Lucas make any effort to identify the hypothetical Pettors or to ascertain whether there was such an organization as the Democratic Victory Scouts, or whether the letter purporting to come from them was genuine. He merely paid the expenses of printing and circulating the document under the heading of "This kind of an Appeal coming from New York from Tammany for the purpose of securing the election of the President of the country is having a good deal of fun over the incident and over Mr. Lucas's statement that he expended \$1,000 of his own money in his enterprise and that the Republican National Committee had nothing to do with it although there was produced before the Nye Committee the correspondence with the Washington bank from which the Republican National Committee, by Robert H. Lucas, requested a

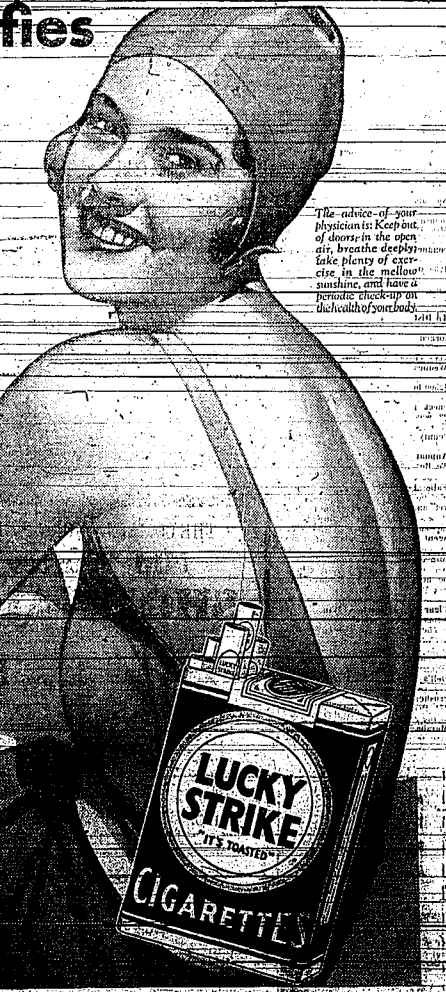

PARIS (AP)—Just why France
has over \$2,000,000,000 in gold sur-
plus is the second largest gold
reserve in the world, is explained
not so much by the war as by
juggling in international finance,
but simply in French thrift.

saving, out-canny the Scots, care-
fully hoarding up their money in
the banks of last century. The

Save to Retire
Mother and father then can

War Caused Thrift
Some people say the French be-
came even more thrifty after the
Franco-German war. Defeated by
the Prussians, they were "chastened"
into saving what they had and
industriously under the banner of
occupation, which was the result
of the war, the desire to be free
from foreign rule.

And in a miraculously short time
the indemnity was paid and the in-
habitants withdrawn. France
Now after years of saving, France
has her reward! At a time when
other nations are suffering from
with financial straits, France is
richer in gold than ever before.
