BENJAMIN FRANKLIN

THE birthday anniversary of one of the greatest men who ever lived is being observed in the United States now through National Thrift Week which started January 17.

Benjamin Franklin was born in Boston, January 17, 1706. His parents were poor. Franklin was one of seventeen children, he being the thirteenth. At the age of eight he was sent to school where he displayed great aptitude for learning.

Franklin's renown spread over the whole civilized world and honors were given him by various learned societies of Europe. In 1762 he returned to America, but soon went to England to adjust difficulties which had arisen between her and the colonies.

When the declaration was pronounced he was appointed United States minister to France. Returning to America in 1785 he was successively chosen member and president of the supreme executive council for Pennsylvania to the convention for the revision and amendment of the articles of the Union.

He retired from public life in 1788, and two years later on June 17, 1790, he passed away at the advanced age of 84.

Franklin's career, like that of many of his countrymen, is an inspiration to the young of this generation who are prone to believe that this is the Golden Age.

The nation annually bows in humble respect to the work and the life of our Richard.

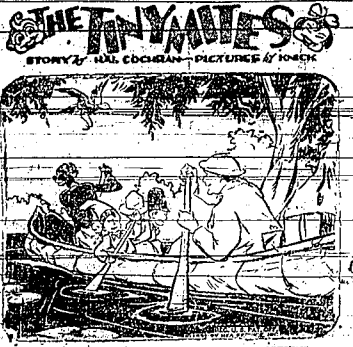
AUTOS AND THE PARADE
