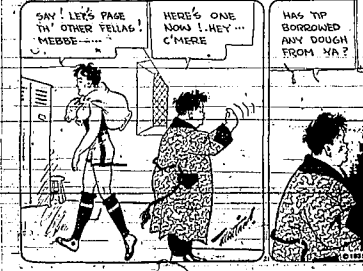

FIND A WAY-OR MAKE ONE

CARPING criticism of the national policy of the American Red Cross regarding disaster relief will perhaps not change a system which admittedly has been adopted after long experience. To the general public there is naturally an unfavorable reaction when offers of charity are flatly turned down.

One of the worst results of such an incident is the effect on Red Cross work and the Red Cross as a whole, which should not be allowed to occur if it is at all possible to avoid it. Maybe the refusals which have met the offers of this community to send food to drought-stricken areas, represent the views of only one man or set of men; maybe they have misinterpreted the so-called "national policy," maybe there is a legitimate way to circumvent the "policy," and send it get food through to the starving hungry throats of those who need it.

Of course the lay mind does not readily comprehend that there should be such a set policy when human life is at stake, as we are told it is; if there is any policy that man recognizes first, that "policy" is to save lives, whether it is throwing a rope to a drowning man, rushing anti-toxin by dog sled or airplane to disease-stricken communities, or by making clothes, hospital pads, or other equipment for the wounded. When there is a cry of hunger, the natural inclination is to think of food and how it can be rushed to those needing it, quickly, economically, and efficiently. The Red Cross, having humanly's needs as its sphere, naturally is assumed to be the logical agency through which to administer relief.

The Red Cross could be compelled to accept the food contributions, if pressure were brought to bear through Governor Ross, for instance, or the Idaho congressional delegation in Washington.

The alternative, of course, for Twin Falls county through an unofficial organization set-up for the purpose of soliciting food donations, to send direct to local organizations in Arkansas or wherever food is needed most, a car or two of potatoes and some beans, and depend upon it being properly distributed.

This would not need to interfere with the Red Cross solicitation of cash funds in line with President Hoover's recommendation.

If the situation in the affected area in the middle west is what it is, it is a desperate one, and it stands in the way of relief. The interests of retailers and wholesalers there, are certainly worthy of no more consideration than are those of retailers and wholesalers here. Every bean and potato given away means loss of potential business for local commission dealers, either in handling charges, or through the fact that fewer beans or potatoes will then be sold commercially. In addition, local retailers and wholesalers would be solicited either for cash or for food, which if the proposition is to put on a commercial basis, as suggested by the western division of the Red Cross, might also be said to be to the detriment of local retail and wholesale interests already seriously affected by present conditions.

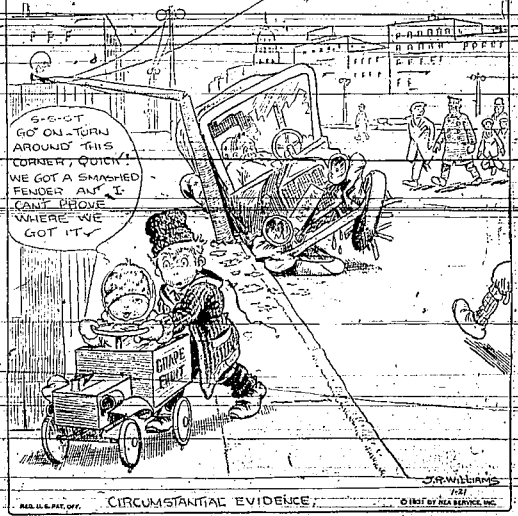
