THE COST OF BREAD

INTERESTING to the general public is the fact that merchandise is declining rapidly in cost. Food is cheaper, as are dry goods, clothing, shoes and many other commodities.

The reasons, of course are that the ingredients of the things we eat and the things we wear for the most part cost less.

However, too often the average consumer is apt to look for the reduction in something he buys to be effective too soon, or in a greater amount than is economically possible.

For instance, because a farmer one day sells a hide at a ridiculously low price, he irks when the price of a pair of shoes he buys the next day has the same price-tag as when hides were high. His complaint is either that the reduced price is too long in taking effect, or that it is not as great as he believes it should be.

But we are told that after all, the cost of hides, or flour, or paper, or lumber, after all does not affect the retail price of commodities to such a great extent as the public would like to believe.

In the case of bread, we are told, that if flour cost the baker nothing, he would still have an average investment of \$4.20 in a hundred pounds of bread,

while if it cost him as much as \$6.00 a barrel, the 100 pounds of bread would represent an investment to him of \$6.22. His set costs, as compiled and published by a baker's trade publication include: overhead 60 cents; selling-delivery costs \$1.75; production costs \$1.05; ingredients aside from flour 80 cents; plus the cost of the flour, which at \$6 a barrel is \$2.03, at \$5 a barrel is \$1.70 and at \$4 a barrel is \$1.36. In addition there is to be added his normal profit.

Says the statement "From these figures it is easily seen that for every dollar drop in the price of flour, the cost of bread to the baker is lowered only 33 cents per 100 pounds of bread, or one third of a cent a loaf."

"The price of flour is not the governing factor in the price of bread. It is only one of the many factors and those of operating and selling costs are steadily increasing."

Investigations being carried on in this matter can only result in good to industry as a whole, and especially to the baking industry, for any study into the matter is bound to prove that although wheat is cheap, bread will certainly not be as proportionately cheap.

The bakery people should and will welcome the investigation.

THE GASOLINE TAX

A NEWSPAPER writer recently pointed out that the average American motorist pays no less than \$18 a year in gasoline taxes. If this sum were collected in a lump, the motorist would kick like a steer, but if it is taken from him painlessly, and he hardly notices it,

The average tax is four cents a gallon—a sales tax, ineffective or about 25 per cent. If any other commodity in daily use were taxed at that rate the country would become equally vocal in protest, but the gasoline tax is paid without a whisper.

Perhaps this is chiefly because the money is used to build roads. Every motorist wants good roads, and the justice of making automobile owners pay for the pavements on which they ride is obvious. But some states have shown a tendency in recent years, to transfer some of the gasoline tax revenues to other parts of the state budget; and if that tendency continues, complaints against the tax can be expected to grow mightily in volume. It is right that the motorist help build new roads. It is not right that he pay more than his share of the cost of maintenance of other state activities.

THE OLD AND THE NEW

THE effects of the crop failure of last summer in many parts of the United States is painfully apparent. It is extremely interesting to notice what happens when a similar crop failure hits a land that has no relief organizations, no modern transportation systems and no methods whatever of providing help for the sufferers.

Thus a government commission in China has recently reported that more than 2,000,000 people have died of famine caused by drought in Shensi province during the last two years. In addition, 100,000 have been sold into slavery.

The American famine is a major problem, but it is not even remotely like that horror. The demonstration of the value of modern forms of transportation, communication and organization is obvious.
