Dame Nellie Melba Passes in
Australia After Illness of
Short Duration; Had Distinguished Career As A Singer

MELBOURNE, Australia, Feb. 23 (UP)—Dame Nellie Melba, the world's greatest soprano, died at the age of 66, after a short illness, at her home in Melbourne, Australia.

"Death came to the opera star, one of the world's greatest sopranos, in her sixty-sixth year, after a short illness which began on Feb. 19, at her home in Melbourne, Australia."

"She was born in Australia, but spent most of her life in England, where she sang at the Royal Opera House, Covent Garden, and at the London Opera House."

"The 'Milkmaid' and 'The Maid of the Mountains' were her first successes, and she became one of the most popular singers of the day."

"She was married to a man named Charles, but they were divorced, and she lived the rest of her life as a widow."

"She was a devoted mother and a devoted friend, and she was loved by all who knew her."
