HOOVER VETOS "MUSCLE SHOALS" POWER MEASURE

President Returns Bill to Congress With Statement That Passage Would Injure to Stride Toward Degeneration

WASHINGTON, March 3 (UP)—Having the North Atlantic coast by embracing the trust of government ownership, President Hoover today returned to Congress the bill for the Muscle Shoals power project, with the emphatic veto message.

"This measure, providing for government operation of the Muscle Shoals power project, and distribution of power and manufacture of fertilizers, is based on principles which would lead to liberation—but to degeneration," the president said.

"The power problem is not to be solved by the federal government," Hoover said. "It is to be solved by the private industry."

"The government's responsibility is to create a climate in which the private industry can develop and operate the Muscle Shoals power project, not to take over the project itself."

"The government should not be a competitor of the private industry in the production of power, but should be a promoter of justice and equal opportunity for all who are engaged in the production of power."

"The government should not be a monopolist in the production of power, but should be a promoter of competition and efficiency."

EXPERTS ISSUE SPRAYING HINTS FOR FRUIT MEN

Oil Methods Are Outlined for Battle Against Mite, Scale and Blister on Trees Native of Idaho and Adjacent Lands

The following is based on several years of experimental work of the Idaho agricultural experiment station and agreed to as a state program by the Idaho state department of agriculture and the experiment station. This program is in agreement with the suggestions of the Western Oil Sheny Co-operative project.

DORMANT SPRAYS 1. Dormant sprays are those applied in the spring before bud scales separate and before buds show green. 2. Insects may result if oil emulsion sprays are applied during the critical period (delayed dormant) of bud development. 3. There is no evidence that injury results from low temperatures when oil emulsion sprays are applied in the spring, during the dormant period.

SAX JOSE SCALE 1. Liquid lime-sulphur of oil sprays are usually equally effective in Idaho when application is thorough. In southern Idaho 30 gallons of spray use four gallons of commercial oil emulsion and 30 gallons of water. In the Lewiston district use five gallons of commercial oil emulsion and 25 gallons of water.

FRUIT TREE LEAF HOLLER Lime-sulphur is not effective. Use eight gallons of commercial emulsion to make 100 gallons of spray for cleaning up excess infestations. In moderate infestations, 10 to 12 gallons of concentrate (testing 32 degrees B) to 100 gallons of water.

PEACH TWIG BORER (Peach, Prune, twig borer) Oil emulsion is not effective. Use 20 gallons of liquid lime-sulphur solution to make 100 gallons of spray. This gives excellent control and any time from late February until blossoms begin to show color.

PEACH LEAF CURL AND CALIFORNIA PEACH BLIGHT Use lime-sulphur as for peach twig borer or use Bordeaux mixture 4-5-50 the first and second applications.

APHIDS ON FRUIT TREES Dormant oil emulsion spray as for Sax Jose scale gives commercial control. Lime-sulphur does not kill aphids.

SAX JOSE SCALE AND FRUIT TREE LEAF HOLLER Both are controlled by one dormant application of oil emulsion at leaf roller strength.

ORDINANCE ASKED BY ELECTRICIANS

Delegation Submits Measure to City Council; Would Provide For Examinations, Licensing

A delegation of Twin Falls electrical contractors Monday evening submitted to the city council a draft of an ordinance which would require an examination and licensing of electrical installers and fitters of long line electrical work.

Under the terms of the proposed ordinance, the city council would name an electrical inspector to act on all jobs involving electricians, electrical contractors would be required to pay a license fee of \$5 the first year and \$3 thereafter; so-called "journeymen" electricians would be required to pay a fee of \$1 per year and electrical apprentices would pay \$1 per year.

The journeymen electricians and electrical apprentices would, under the terms of the ordinance, be made to take an examination under a board of examiners composed of one supervisor, one journeyman and the electrical inspector.

In submitting the ordinance, the delegation stated that the Twin Falls now has no similar legislation. An ordinance which would make similar laws was reported about two years ago because of an accident from the city station which resulted in the death of a man.

An action on the proposed measure was taken by the council, but the draft was referred to the city attorney for study and the ordinance was postponed indefinitely at the city attorney's request.

The council filed the ordinance with the city attorney, and the Twin Falls planning inspector, and in the morning of the ordinance, Mr. Murray stated the ordinance was postponed because of falling prices and asked that it be made effective at an early date as practicable.

The action of the city attorney, Charles Matthews, showed a balance of \$1,000 in the city treasury on March 1 in February 1.

An application for a license to act as a city engineer was submitted to the city engineer by John S. Kitcher for \$1,000. The application was approved by the city engineer.
