# 1931-BAD YEAR FOR HOLDOUTS IN BIG LEAGUES

But Eight Players Remain Unsigned of Vast Throng Demanding Raises

NEW YORK, Mar. 18 (UP)—The 1931 season for the eight remaining holdouts in the big leagues is about to get underway, but the season will be the most unsuccessful year for major league holdouts.

Although the opening of the spring training season saw an unusually large crop of holdouts, all but eight players now are under contract and not a single holdout has won a salary increase. Bill Terry of the Giants, Lou Gehrig of the Yankees, Carl Hubbs of the White Sox, Eddie Morgan of the Indians and many other prominent players have refused to support their demands for larger salaries.

To support, with the club owners presenting a united front against the demands for increased pay, the players were forced to take the contracts tendered by quit baseball. Most of the players accepted the inevitable and at present the only unsigned major league players are:
