Rescuers Cross Four Mile Ice Pack; Save Viking Survivors

SHIP CREWS WIN BATTLE AGAINST STORM AND FLOE

120 Marooned and Starving

Men are Supplied With
Food and Clothing

SHIPS 4 MILES AWAY

Boats are Used to Crush
Way to Island

ST. JOHNS, N. F., Mar. 18 (UPI)—Food, medical supplies and a small boat were sent to 120 marooned survivors of the wrecked sealing ship Viking today, after a treacherous battle with the ice that barred rescue ships from Horse Island.

The rescuers, spurred on by frantic calls from the "victims" of the island, made a super-human effort, and a party from the steamers Ironore, Boothia and Samson, which had been sending supplies across the four miles of treacherous, broken ice to the island.

More accompanied the relieved party. Before they reached their destination they were met by men from the ship, who had set out to make a desperate, private attempt to reach the ship. The men from the island were supplied with food and clothing and were given a new lease on life, which will be transferred later to the Sogoma.

The relief party, including the men who had been marooned, had to travel to aid those still remaining there. The Imogen is the nearest of the seven sealing ships that became frozen in the ice, about three miles away, and unable to force its way through the heavy ice.

Russia Output May Set Price of World's Oil

Refineries Expected to Show Production That Will Influence

Quality Reported High

Two Year Rush Has Made European Mark

LONDON, Mar. 19 (UP) — Oil experts told the United Press today that Russia's petroleum activities will be a determining factor in average 1931 prices.

"British, Dutch, German, French and United States oil representatives meeting here today said the present year would be slightly higher than last year if the Italian element could be left out of account."

Consumption in Great Britain of gasoline last year increased 12 percent. Another digit, ten percent, is expected for this year. Constant expansion of world consumption and curtailment of production in the United States and other countries, except for the Russian phantasm, given for a hopeful 1931 price outlook.

— 25 Number Refineries

According to statistical bulletins issued by the Supreme Economic Council of Soviet Russia, there are 25 refineries in Transcaucasian Russia. These plants are capable of refining annually 10,431,600 barrels.

Total of circles wonder just how long Russian refineries can maintain the pace of output recorded during 1930. Some authorities believe that Russian plants are on the ragged edge and need to be repaired. Others say that officials hold up during its present year prices will probably be affected accordingly.

Gasoline prices are received principally by France, Great Britain and Germany. In most cases, Russian prices of just under those countries are followed closely. For the average price per gallon, reported by Russia to the Conference of the League of Nations, is three cents lower than other countries.

Russian Oil Rich

Experts agree that Russian

gasoline is in special gravity and high point qualities. Both gasoline

and lubricant oils made from Russian crude rank well.

In Great Britain the total refining capacity is in the neighborhood of 10 million barrels a day per year. There has been little expansion during the past few years, although improvement of methods has caused a reduction in cost. The market is likely to take place shortly in Great Britain. All of the oil refined in Great Britain is now produced in Scotland, produced in Britain, only in small home consumer amounts, is secured from shale in Scotland.
