
OUTLAWS PLAN CONTEST HERE

FLOWERS FOR THE LIVING

COMPLIMENT to the work of E. N. Pettygrove, Twin Falls county representative in the lower house of the state legislature, was paid by a Boise political writer in a resume of the outstanding personalities of the house and senate, and published in the Sunday Idaho Statesman.

Said the capital city observer:

Another veteran who sprang suddenly into the limelight this session was Pettygrove of Twin Falls county. Pettygrove has been known as a keen advocate of agrarian legislation in past sessions, but as little else; and there were grave doubts in various places when he was marked for assistant floor leader. He proved, however, effective in that place; he developed into a convincing debater on the floor, a quick maneuverer, a man who could command the respect of his fellow-partisans.

On the same day, another Boise correspondent took special effort to pay tribute to James D. Whelan, well-known Twin Falls newspaperman. Of Mr. Whelan, this writer said in his dispatch:

Out of the maze of bills that passed or failed to pass the last legislature were several which bore a touch of a veteran newspaperman, James D. Whelan, now of the Twin Falls News, but with a record of service on several Idaho papers as well as on journals in four other states and Mexico.

In a quiet but persistent way, he had considered able to do framing that part of the Democratic platform which called for a revision of the initiative and referendum laws and enactment of the direct primary.

Twin Falls, with this added attraction which skins Boise and Pocatello and Coeur d'Alene and the rest all hollow: only fifty miles from the Nevada line. Only an hour's drive to wide-open gambling and freedom! Where officers wink at indulgence in light wines and beers, etc.
