KNUTE ROCKNE DIES IN AIRPLANE CRASH

Famous Coach, 8 Others Killed as Transport Falls

BAZAAR, Kan., Mar. 31 (UP)—Knute Rockne, noted Notre Dame football coach and eight other men were killed in an airplane crash near here today. The plane, operated by the Transcontinental and Western Air, Inc., was en route from Kansas City to Los Angeles. Rockne was listed as a passenger on the plane when it left Kansas City earlier in the day. Persons who reached the wreckage of the craft said there were no survivors. The plane did not burn. The plane crashed on the farm of Stewart Baker near here. It was a combination passenger and mail plane. The passenger list was reported here to include: Knute Rockne, J. H. Christian, S. Goldwater, An unidentified man from Chicago. Two pilots and Robert Frey, steward, Edward Baker, a farmer, was feeding stock on the Stewart Baker farm and was watching the plane as it flew over. Suddenly, he said, there was an explosion and the ship fell to the earth. The plane was flying at a low altitude because of the cloudy weather. First check of the debris showed there were nine bodies in the plane. One of the Baker household heard the explosion and rushed to the scene, half a mile away. Rockne was making a hurried trip to the Pacific coast for a conference regarding a movie contract. He reached Kansas City early this morning and spent a short time with his two sons, William, 14, and Knute, Jr., 13, attending the Pembroke school there. The two sons had just returned to Kansas City from a trip to Miami, Fla. The plane planned to spend only a few days on the coast, and to visit his sons again in Kansas City on the way back.

U. S. MARINES IN CHARGE

Dead and Dying Seen After Walls Collapse

MANAGUA, Nicaragua, Mar. 31 (UP)—(Via Special Radio to United Press)—A severe earthquake lasting only four to six seconds shook Managua at 10:30 A. M. on Monday, leveling all buildings, especially the higher ones. Fire started in the market in the central part of town, which was crowded. Women and children were in the throng. 85 Trapped. It was reported one section of the market fell in, held approximately 50 people who were burned to death. The lowest, the largest, hole was down, all but one wall. Dead and dying were seen in the street. The street was filled in many cases with other wounded and dead. United States Marines were doing all possible to pick up bodies from the streets, when they were possible to remove them. The National Guard fired dynamite to crawling in the fire to check. It was at last reported the dynamite was all gone. The water mains were broken in several places, spilling through the pavements. The power plant was in working condition but the current was cut off as a safety measure to prevent deaths in the streets from broken high-tension wires. Gen. Preston Brown, commander of military forces in the central zone, radioed the war department that the city of Managua had been destroyed completely and was in flames. Brown asked the department to advise him whether he should send aid to the stricken city. He has more than 8,000 officers and men under his control in the central zone. Gen. Preston Brown, representative of the National Guard, is at Managua. Washington by airplane this afternoon for Managua, to organize relief work. CHIEF ISSUES DENIAL Says Group Formed Under Justice Department

WASHINGTON, Mar. 31 (UP)—The Justice Department today announced a list of 50 individuals living in the United States for sending out a recall of nut food, Monday by the Federal government, among distributors of the nut industry. Direct and specific charges of price-fixing, artificial transportation charges, blacklisting and other alleged violations of the anti-trust laws were made against 50 defendants comprising the institute. The suit, filed by the United States district attorney at New York, asks a permanent injunction against the institute, forbidding the refusal to recognize the membership from maintaining "a comprehensive scheme designed to fix uniform and oppressive prices." The One Fourty. The importance of the action may be visualized when it is recalled that the United States consumes one-fourth of the world's sugar production, that the cane sugar output is more than 5,000,000 tons a year, and that the price of cane sugar ranges from 1 to 1 1/2 cents higher than beet sugar. No beet sugar refiners were named in complaint. One of the charges is that the cane refiners, producing 85 per cent of the sugar consumed in this country, induced the beet sugar refiners to restrict their competitive activities, and thus managed to keep cane prices uniformly higher than the price of beet sugar.

Blind 22 Years, Sees After Eye Operation

PHILADELPHIA, Mar. 31 (UP)—Eyes which have never brought new sensations and revelations beyond expression today to Earl Musselman, 22, whose vision has been made by the skill of a surgeon's knife. The color of flowers and the general appearance of human beings now seem to hold the most attraction for this youth who was born blind, and who learned to know people and objects by sound and touch. Musselman was born without pupils in his eyes. Six weeks ago the G. H. Moore, a specialist of the staff of the Grunbaum hospital, performed an operation. Monday the bandages were removed. Musselman looked at a new world, a world of color sensations in which years of stored up impressions became real, and many impressions were found to be wrong. "The way looks are set in a building; the way color in shadows blends into another; the way trolley tracks run straight beside each other and the way they shine; the way a horse and motor vehicle move; it's all wonderful. "I'm glad to see in my way of seeing an idea of color of the violet beauty of flowers. I had tried to fix colors in my mind from descriptions by teachers and friends who could see but my conception of them was dull and drab compared to the wonderful colors I can now see. Musselman is not able to associate the various color sensations with names. That is one of the things he will have to learn. "I'm trying to read with my eyes already," he said today. "Of course I can't read ordinary type, but the doctors say I'll be able to soon. The alphabet is simple and when my sight is a little better, reading will be no trick at all. He has been able to read with his fingers for years. When Musselman looked at himself in a mirror he jokingly remarked that he looked something like he hooped a monkey looked. "But he admitted that everybody, including himself, was better looking than his 'blind history' of them."
