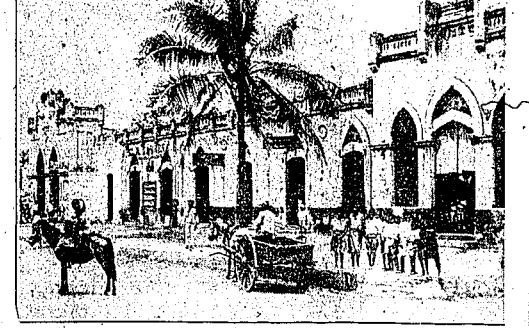

CITY SERIES SCHEDULED

Few Cities Get No Preview Of Nines Before Season

NEW YORK, Apr. 6 (UP)—Baseball's 1934 spring training season has reached the final stage. The Philadelphia Athletics and Baltimore Orioles, among others, in their annual city series and other challenges scheduled to make their home debuts this week.

All teams except the Cleveland Indians have en route to the league territory. The Indians, who break camp, will leave New Orleans Wednesday but will not reach Cleveland until April 12, the day before the opening of the season.

No Home Exhibitions Cleveland, the Chicago Cubs, Cincinnati Reds and St. Louis Browns are the only teams which will not play exhibition games before their home-town fans. Pittsburgh and the Sox open the season away from their home fields until April 22. The Cubs close their exhibition play at Kansas City, April 12, and quit work at Wrigley Field, Chicago on April 13.

The White Sox are making their return trip with the New York Giants and the Cubs will play a two game series at New York Polo grounds Saturday and Sunday. The Sox will play a final exhibition at Toledo, O., April 13, and open the regular season at Cleveland the following day.

Pirates and Tigers Pittsburgh is en route from the Pacific Coast with the Detroit Tigers, and will play the Tigers at Detroit, April 10 and 12, before going to Chicago to open the season with the Cubs.

Cleveland will break its long morning trip with exhibition games against the Cincinnati Reds at Cincinnati Saturday and Sunday. Washington's Senators make their 1934 debut at Griffiths stadium Wednesday in a game with the Boston Braves and will entertain the Philadelphia Phillies Thursday. "Pie" is the Baltimore Friar. Braves will home to close their exhibition series against Baltimore and Rochester respectively on Saturday and Sunday.

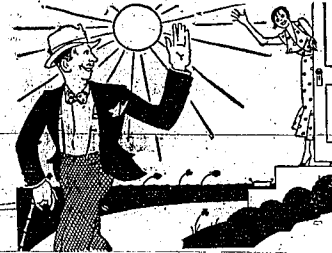

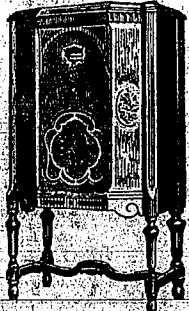
