**Government Issues Orders Protecting U. S. Citizens in Danger Zone**

**WARSHIPS AWAIT ACTION**

**MEANING OF MEMPHIS HAIT STRIKE THREAT**

**PRODIGALPA, Honduras, April 21 (UPI)—Thousands of government troops were concentrating today in the Corozal region of Northern Honduras in most recent outlying attacks.**

**The government ordered protection for the large number of United States citizens at La Lima, in the Corozal zone.**

**San Pedro Sula appears to be the chief immediate objective of the rebel forces, whose activities are centered in the Corozal region with the arrival of three United States warships.**

**With the cooperation of the American legation, the government declared a neutral zone extending around San Pedro Sula, where all messages indicated heavy fighting was expected within a few hours.**

**The federal military leaders have concentrated on the rebel attack in that region and they are confident of success in the anticipated encounter.**

**The action of orders in declaring martial law throughout Honduras which ended the threat of a general strike at Tegucigalpa, was quiet under the guns of the U. S. warships.**

## THE UNITED PRESS

The tenth annual conference of the United Press executive staff which convened in New York Tuesday and continues throughout the week, is conducting business of vital interest to all readers, including those of the Evening Times, which is a United Press client.

Divisional managers from the Pacific coast, southwest, old south and midwest will be present and they are making plans for intensified coverage of North American news coverage primarily.

One of the interesting events on the program will be the reading of a series of cablegrams from newspapers all over the world congratulating the United Press on its two hour "beat" on the announcement of the determination of Ex-King Alfonso to retire from his kingship and leave Spain.

Announcement was made by K. A. Bickel, president of the appointment of Hugh Baillie as executive vice-president of the United Press. Baillie joined the United Press in 1915 in Los Angeles. Later he acted as bureau manager in San Francisco and Portland; city editor in Chicago and Washington, and news manager in the New York bureau. In 1920 he was appointed business manager and later made vice president in charge of business operations.

In his annual report to the organization, Bickel stated that the worldwide clientele of the United Press now reached 1,188 newspapers.

"Despite the general softening of business conditions throughout the world," says Bickel, "United Press has closed the past twelve months with its largest client list and with a record of fewer service changes in the past year than at any time in history."

"Direct service is being maintained to newspapers in 42 nations, and each day United Press dispatches are published in 19 different languages."

Maintaining its policy of constant expansion in the collection of its worldwide news reports, the United Press in the past twelve months has made considerable progress in the development of its worldwide news collection resources, all of which is good news to interested newspaper readers who look to their papers for increasingly fast and reliable service.

## "LITTLE" COUNTRIES

NEW concessions which United States commercial interests have been seeking in the little Central American republic of Honduras are assigned as one of the main reasons for the revolution there by Dr. Carlos A. Perdomo, Hondurian, Charge D'Affaires in Washington.

A powerful economic influence in Honduras which is the largest producer of bananas in the world is exerted by two companies, the United Fruit company and the Standard Fruit and Steamship company. The United has the greater investment there.

The present revolt is centered about the four ports controlled by the two fruit companies, through which most of the republic's foreign trade passes. United States interests have invested \$71,485,000 in Honduras to exploit their rich fruit-growing soil—more than in any other Central American country.

The proposed new concessions, although of prime importance, are not the only aggravating cause of the revolt, Dr. Perdomo adds. The personal ambitions of what he describes as "second rate" military leaders and dissatisfaction among workers due to seasonal unemployment at the close of the banana season are other factors which have fanned the flames.

Finances of the United States have made nearly one-third of their total Central American investments in Honduras. The United Fruit company alone has invested from \$40,000,000 to \$50,000,000, it is estimated.

The United Fruit company now has pending before a special session of the Honduras congress a petition for a concession involving irrigation of about 24,000 acres of land, according to Dr. Perdomo. The press of the country, he said, is almost solidly against it unless taxes are increased upon all those who would benefit by the irrigation project.

"This is seen that the United States is beginning to have its hands full with these annoying problems from 'little' countries, and the end is not yet!"

**HOOPER ON SANDINO**

A UNITED PRESS dispatch says that President Hoover denounces the Nicaraguan insurgent General Augustine Sandino as having placed himself outside the civilized pale by the cold-blooded murder of eight or nine American citizens. The chief executive is confident Sandino soon would be brought to justice.

A determined drive against Sandino and his followers is now being made by the Nicaraguan Guardia Nacional, the president says. He adds more than 17,800 men are now operating against the insurgent leader, a force several times as great as that of Sandino.

Simultaneously with the President's statement Rear Admiral Arthur S. C. Smith, commander of the special service squadron, reports to the navy department that the United States is sending to the Nicaraguan waters a fleet of 12 destroyers.

Officials of the United States are becoming increasingly concerned over Sandino. This country is certain under obligation to quit fooling and bring him

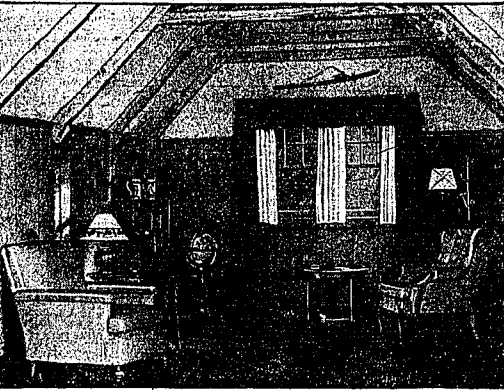

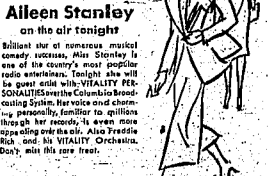

List Includes Varied Kinds For Everyday and Special Occasions

A Simple Salad for Formal Dinner  
If you are planning a formal dinner, nothing is nicer than a simple lettuce and tomato salad.

Lettuce and Tomato Salad  
Wash, slice tomatoes, peeled and sliced, and sliced lettuce. Place over your car—can be arranged with lettuce to make many interesting and inviting salads. Lettuce and tomato salad seems to taste best when served with a rather tart dressing to which a touch of anchovies has been added. Vegetable dressing would be a particularly happy selection.

Vinagrette Dressing  
In a bowl put one teaspoon of salt and one teaspoon of sugar. Add one-half teaspoon of vinegar and one-half teaspoon of oil. Mix thoroughly. When these ingredients have been mixed together, pour in twelve tablespoons of Weston Oil. The oils together easily. Then add three tablespoons of sliced vinegar. Add two tablespoons of chopped dill pickle, and one teaspoon of chopped parsley. Stir well until all ingredients are thoroughly mixed.

Some house people prefer to substitute one tablespoon of serrano vinegar for one tablespoon of sliced vinegar. Try it, and see which flavor you like best.

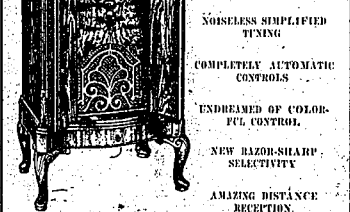
FRUIT SALAD FOR AN APPETIZER

Orange and Grapefruit Salad  
After peeling the oranges and grapefruit, remove the membrane from the sections. Arrange the sections—alternating slices of orange and grapefruit—on the plate with the narrow edges down so that they form half a ball. To add a touch of color, insert the divisions of the sections with strips of salted celery parsley and lettuce. Make a pretty garnish for the salad.

The dressing should take away some of the bite of acid in the fruit, and yet not be too sweet.

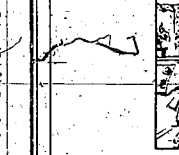

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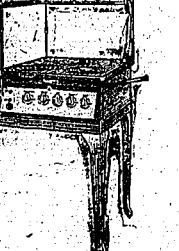
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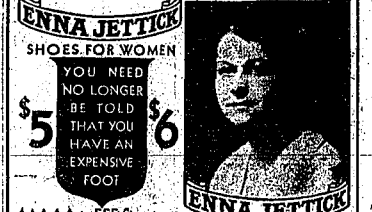

## PROPER SETTINGS FOR EVERY KIND TO BE EXPLAINED

### Teachings to Show Dressings and Occasions Which Dish Should Be Used

# Recipes Issued by Mrs. Scott in First Session Of Evening Times School

### THE ONE PIECE MEAL

**Spanish Casserole**  
Place in a skillet which has a tight fitting cover  
1 tablespoon oil  
1/2 pound onion, chopped fine  
1/2 pound lean shoulder of pork cut in 1/4 inch cubes  
1/2 cup chopped green pepper  
1 small can chopped red tomatoes, if needed  
1/2 teaspoon each garlic salt, and celery salt  
1 teaspoon salt  
1 teaspoon pepper, paprika  
Brown slightly, add  
1 can tomato soup  
1 can water  
2 cups uncooked noodles  
Cover tightly and cook very slowly for 1 1/2 hours, just before serving add 1/2 cup grated American cheese. Spaghetti or macaroni may be used, or 1 cup uncooked rice. Serve with a green salad and fruit dessert.

Milk Turkey Brimblets  
(Unnecessary to wait until Monday)  
Have vent shoulder sliced thin. Pound well, and cut in strips two inches wide. Meats around skewers salt each skewer in "well-padded." One and a half pounds make eight good drumsticks.  
Method 2  
Arrange on wooden skewers alternating cubes of veal and pork cut about 1/2 inch square, using 4 or 5 for each skewer.  
Roll each "drumstick" in crushed dry cereal flakes, in egg diluted with 3 tablespoons milk or water and again in the cereal flakes. Steam and brown on all sides in oil, 3/4 cup water. Bake at 350 degrees for 1 hour. This can be covered or left to dry, choice. This

### Appetizers with Orange Sauce

(Various kinds of vegetables, steamed or au gratin, may be served instead - these are prepared along with the frozen salmon and need only to be heated through before serving.)  
1/2 pound veal in double boiler  
2 beaten egg yolks or 1 whole egg  
2 tablespoons butter  
1 teaspoon each of salt and paprika  
1 teaspoon sugar or honey  
Cook until mixture thickens. Then add:  
2 tablespoons orange juice  
1 tablespoon lemon juice  
Grated dash of 1 orange  
Mix well and pour your sauce over hot fresh or canned asparagus. This sauce is equally good served with hot or baked beans.  
Refrigerator Rolls  
(A versatile over-ready "fill-up")  
1 cake of compressed yeast in 1 cup lukewarm water  
5 1/2 cups flour  
1 cup boiling water  
1/2 cup shortening  
2 teaspoons salt  
1 cup sugar  
When thoroughly dissolved add:  
1 cup cold water  
2 well beaten eggs and the yolk  
With a large heavy mixing spoon and your best elbow power, stir 5 cups sifted flour, or slightly more.  
Stir until very thoroughly mixed. This takes the place of kneading. Turn into a well greased bowl. Turn the dough over to grease the top, cover lightly and place in the refrigerator. This makes a soft dough - not sticky however. An elastic dough describes it better. This makes about 1/2 dozen rolls. To shape rolls pinch off a small piece of dough, roll between both hands, which are well greased. Do not knead. Place in a well greased pan and let rise a bit over an hour, or until more than doubled in bulk. Bake about 15 minutes at 425 degrees. This mixture is not suitable for thick loaves. Variation given under "Accessories."

### ON GREENS

When the salad is served between the main course and the dessert, it should be appetizing, light and tart. It should not be too heavy. The fresh simple flavors of greens are most appropriate. Lettuce, endive, cucumber, or cold vegetables, such as asparagus, Brussels sprouts or string beans. These salads suggest a tart, stimulating dressing - - Bicycle Club Dressing - Vinaigrette Dressing or French Dressing.  
To make French Dressing: Six tablespoons of Weston Oil, one teaspoon of salt, one-fourth teaspoon of pepper, two tablespoons of lemon juice, a dash of paprika, and lemon juice to your taste.

### ON FRUITS

Fruits, fresh or canned, have a more pronounced flavor than the simple greens. They call for a dressing like sharp, with perhaps a dash of sweetness or the tang of citrus, to encourage them to give us back their sunshine and full fresh flavor.  
The next time you have a fruit try this Clover Dressing. Cream a three-ounce package of cream cheese with two tablespoons of Weston Oil. Blend teaspoon of salt, one-fourth teaspoon each of white pepper and granulated sugar, two tablespoons Weston Oil and two of lemon juice. Beat into the cheese until it becomes light and fluffy. Then dust with paprika.

### FOR SEAFOOD

When salad is the main dish at a meal, as at luncheon tea or supper, and boasts the full flavor of lobster, crabmeat, or shrimp, the finished salad should be garnished with Lemonade or Tartar Sauce. But the fish should first have been marinated.  
To marinate: Mix six tablespoons Weston Oil and two tablespoons of vinegar. Add a teaspoon of salt, one-eighth teaspoon of pepper. Put fish over sea food and set aside in the refrigerator for several hours. Serve with Lemonade.
