MORE STATISTICS ON CRIME ASKED BY WICKERSHAM

Committee Reports Lack of Data, and Suggests Five Major Steps

WANT NEW JUSTICE POLICE SUGGESTS STATE BUREAU FOR CENTRALIZING FACTS

WASHINGTON, Apr. 27 (UP)—Lack of satisfactory data on crime and punishment prevents an authoritative knowledge of the real extent of crime in this country, the Wickersham commission has reported to President Hoover.

The commission recommended five major steps: 1. Centralization of statistics on federal administration of justice in one bureau of the department of justice. 2. Collection by the census bureau of nationwide crime data as soon as state legislation has been completed.

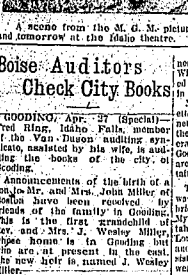

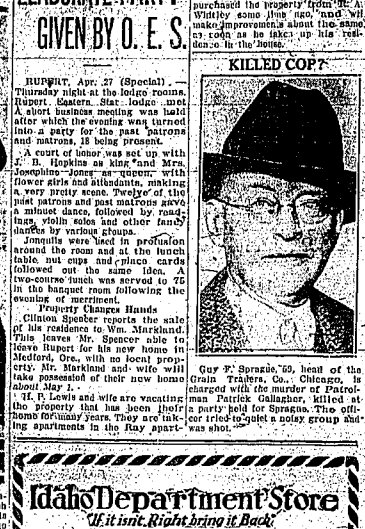

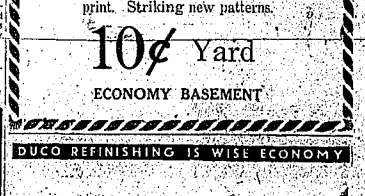
