

O'Hearn, Undefeated Boxer, Meets Cortez Here Tuesday

KANSAS CITY BOY
IS RECOMMENDED
BY FINE RECORD

Past Fights Show Bozo Man
Up Against Tough Battle
In Legion Bout

One of the features which should attract a capacity crowd of fans to the Chryslar garage in Twin Falls for the American Legion fight is the possibility that Joe Cortez, Idaho fighter who has almost without exception beaten every man he has met in his territory, may meet the Waterboy in the person of Jack O'Hearn, the Kansas City boxer who will clash with Cortez in a 15-round match bout.

O'Hearn, undefeated hitherto in 15 bouts, was born in 1911, when he is said to have never been defeated. Some of his decision victories have been in a remarkable display of boxing. Philbin, well-tempered now fighting in Chile; Al Marino, San Francisco; Tony D'Amato, Sacramento; Mickey Wallace, water engine of Nevada and Arizona; O'Hearn, Koch, Palmer, New York, the last record 20-0.

The Mizzena weighed well in the blues at 151 lbs, while Cortez, the taller, weighed 152. Both will have no easy ease on weight. O'Hearn is said by those who know him to be a very boxer, while Cortez is said to be a sturdy fighter who has an unusual way of getting the last man to justify Johnson's move.
