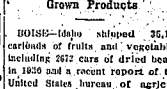

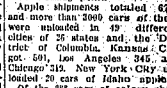

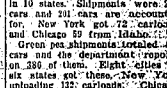

GENERAL BUSINESS CONDITIONS

From the Monthly Bank Letter for May issued by The National City Bank of New York

APRIL brought little change in the general business situation and equally little reason to expect previous views regarding the outlook for improvement according to the monthly review published by The National City Bank of New York, which expresses the belief that "time alone is a very important element in business recovery at this juncture and the passage of four months from what it is hoped will prove the bottom of the depression has brought gains not only in activity but in correction of maladjustments which carry us that much nearer the eventual upturn."

The review mentions the action of the stock market during April as a reflection both of dissatisfaction with present corporate earnings and of doubt that substantial improvement in those earnings can be expected this summer, but attention to the fact that similar situations in the past have afforded the opportunity for forward and far-sighted investors to buy the foundations for large future gains.

The automobile industry provides the best news of the business month; the review declares, pointing out that while still below the level of preceding years, production has continued to show a greater than seasonal gain, there by offering cheer because output is being carefully adjusted to sales requirements. In the renewed decline in commodity prices wheat has been an exception, having advanced early in the month and held part of the gain. Retail trade is spotted. Cotton needs trade in west ports of approximately 40 per cent as compared with the corresponding period a year ago, and 25 per cent from March to 20 for the third week.
