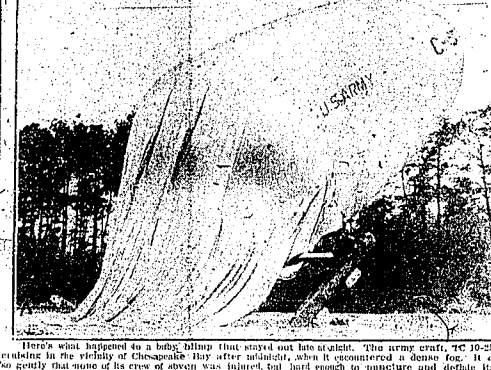

Modernized Home Proves Big Aid to Social Prestige

Family Often Judged By House Appearance

To the stranger of casual passage, the exterior of a home is the only criterion of the social prestige of the owner. The occupants of the home are judged largely by the exterior lines of the building.

If the home is modern in appearance with pleasing lines and well-proportioned accessories, the visitor is influenced more favorably toward the owner than toward his neighbor down the street who lives in an antiquated dwelling of residence which was the style back in the thirties.

An unfair and often entirely erroneous estimate is apt to be admitted, yet one based on human nature.

Aids to Prestige

A modern home adds to social prestige. The owner of a modern residence is looked upon with respect because visible evidence is present that he has taste and appreciation of beauty and the ability to gratify these.

From the standpoint of the interests of the home, a modernized home has its social advantages. It does not welcome the guests with a more pronounced feeling of satisfaction. It shows that the exterior lines are pleasing and that the interior shows good taste and intelligence.

Nowadays, it is an easy and inexpensive to have a house which is as good as new, even old, that to some owners who favor style in the exterior, it is more than a mere decoration.

Old Public School House Now Apartment Building

These old buildings, soundly constructed in a workmanlike manner and now abandoned by the occupants of a new generation, are purchased by investors and transformed into a useful abode of times.

But as the carpenter and contractor have done these buildings were of little value, commanding only a slight price of the market. If the buildings were purchased at a figure that has been covered the value of the ground upon which they stand.

But modernized, they proved to be a sound investment and profitable.

To the left is an illustration of a building which will soon be the home of four families. Study the picture; the building carries the air of dignity and worth. The white limestone trim reflects the possibility of the brick veneer and conveys a spirit of quiet restraint.

This building, indeed as it appears, is the old public schoolhouse, as supplied to exterior finish in the same building by the architect. The decorative design in the gable and the remains of the old frame that set off the number of the building.

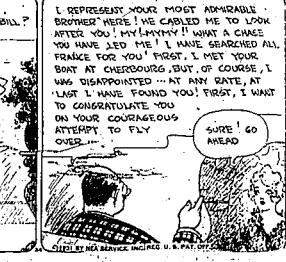
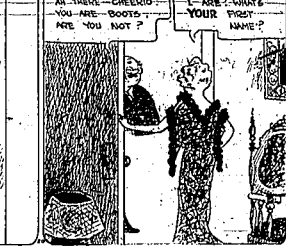

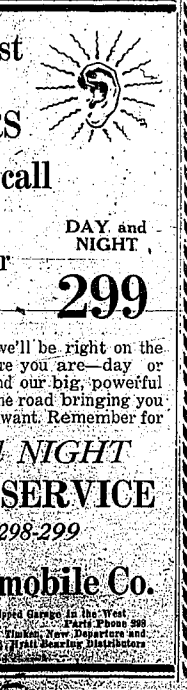
