

CUBS CAN'T HIT STRIDE IN BOUTS WITH EAST CLUBS

National League Favorites Have Dropped Six of Seven Games

ATHLETICS WIN 11TH EARSHAW PITCHES SHUTOUT BALL AGAINST DETROIT

NEW YORK, May 20 (UP)—Baseball club of the National League are giving a serious response to the persistent aspirations of the Chicago Cubs.

The Cubs, who won eleven out of sixteen contests against western clubs, have dropped 6 of 7 games to eastern clubs and although they still lead fourth place in the league standings, their percentage has fallen to an even 50.

This far in their inter-sectional competition, the Cubs have lost two games to each New York and Philadelphia club and one each to Brooklyn and St. Louis. They are still 11½ games behind the leaders of the National League.

Eight in First Boston handed Chicago, its sixth setback at the hands of eastern aggressors, when it was defeated by a right arm drive in the first inning, during which they drove City Baseball out of the mound and continued their assault on Shant (Blanco, enabled the Braves to win.

The St. Louis Cardinals retained their lead game lead in the National League by winning from Detroit 6 to 2. Five Robin errors aided the Cardinals in their run against the Philadelphia club. St. Louis took three hits until the eighth when its weak defense was exposed by Earl Coughlin. The Cardinals combined six errors and seven strikeouts to score five runs during the contest.

New York Wins New York kept within a half game of the Philadelphia Athletics by winning from Cincinnati 9 to 2.

In the other National League contest, George Earshaw pitched the Philadelphia Athletics to their eleventh consecutive victory when he shut out Detroit 6 to 0.




