

FIGHT STARTED FOR REDUCTION OF SPUD RATES

Interstate Commission Gets Pleading For Freight Cut To East... BIG SAVING PROMISED Request Would Blash 18 to 20 Cents Per Hundred

SALT LAKE CITY, May 25 (UP)—Tight to reduce freight rates on shipments of Idaho potatoes to eastern and southern states has been launched today... A complaint filed with the interstate commerce commission by W. H. Trickett, general manager of the Pacific coast, north of the freight service of Utah, reduction of 18 to 20 cents per hundred on carload shipments of potatoes east and south of Utah, Ill., was filed.

The complaint brands the present rates as excessive and unfair. If granted, the reduction asked would effect a saving of approximately 50 per cent.

Trickett said the reductions were sought to permit Idaho growers to market a larger percentage of their crop in the southern central markets. Approximately 250 defendant railroads were named in the complaint.

IDAHO DIVORCES AND MARRIAGES SHOW DECREASE

WASHINGTON, May 25.—The bureau of the census announces that, according to the returns received, there were 4,191 marriages and 1,821 divorces in Idaho in 1929, as compared with 4,779 in 1928, representing a decrease of 20 or 25 per cent. In 1928, there were 5,075 divorces granted in the state, as compared with 3,236 in 1929, representing a decrease of 35 or 40 per cent. In 1929, there were 844 marriages annulled in 1929, as compared with 1,026 in 1928.

The estimated population of the state of Idaho on July 1, 1929, was 445,000, and on July 1, 1928, 444,000. On the basis of these estimates, the number of marriages per 1,000 of the population was 20.1 in 1929, as against 22.7 in 1928.

In Twin Falls county, there were 245 marriages in 1929, and 246 in 1928. The divorce rate increased from 59 in 1929 to 64 in 1928.

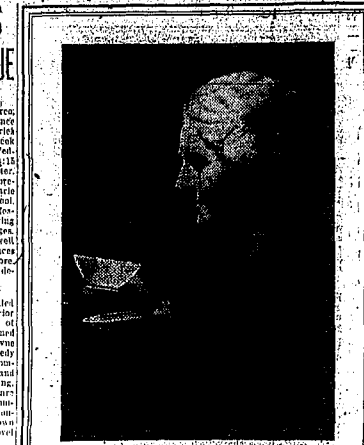

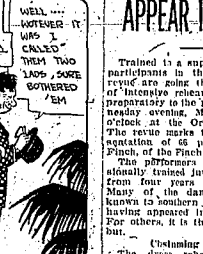
