## FIGHT STARTED FOR REDUCTION OF SPUD RATES

Interstate Commission Gets Petition for Freight Cut To East

BIG SAVING PREDICTED

Request Would Slash 18 to 20 Cents Per Hundred

SALT LAKE CITY, May 26 (UPI)—A fight to reduce freight rates on shipments of Idaho potatoes east and west has begun. The battle had been launched today.

In a complaint filed with the Interstate Commerce Commission by W. H. Peixotto, general manager of the truck service of Utah, reductions of 18 to 20 cents per hundred pounds were demanded to points east and southwest of Idaho City, Wyo.

The complaint brands the present rates as inequitable and unfair.

It is estimated the reduction asked would effect a saving of approximately \$63 per hundred.
