THREE ARIZONA WOMEN FACING MURDER TRIALS

Each May Be Sent to Death If State Can Prove Guilt

PHOENIX, Ariz., June 5 (AP)—Three Arizona women awaited trial today on charges of first degree murder for which the maximum penalty in the event of conviction is death by hanging.

The Twin Falls highway district, not only supports, and maintains highways directly necessary to the farming community, but also must build and maintain all the roads in and across vacant lands not included in various other highway districts.

It is further to be noted that the

state of Idaho has not taken over its share of the highways which are actually used in inter-county, inter-state, and inter-community travel, and thus the Twin Falls highway district has the burden placed upon it of maintaining these highways over which especially heavy travel prevails which is of a nature which is not within the limits of wear as compared with the roads of other highway districts in this Twin Falls county of the ordinary farm market community.

This highway district has the greatest number of miles of roads to maintain and the greatest bonded indebtedness of any highway district in the state, and the greatest expense of maintenance of highways which should be controlled solely of the highway districts in this Twin Falls county.

The situation and the requirements for highways in the Twin Falls highway district present serious striking facts, says the statement:

"This district not only has and needs to foster the two principal highway system routes in the state, but also has a very great mileage of farm roads throughout the district, and because of the history of the Twin Falls highway district, it is necessary for it to maintain all of the other roads in the county not included in the other highway districts, although many of these roads are only slightly related to the needs of the majority of residents within the Twin Falls highway district. The district was one of the very first to put up its money for the construction of U. S. No. 30 route and even today the state money in order to hasten the project, as a result of this early financial assistance, this district is paying an added expense of \$38,777 total interest on the U. S. No. 30 project alone.
